THE SACRED LITURGY THIS WEEK

<u>Monday May 4, Blessed Marie-Léonie Paradis</u>, was born in L'Acadie, Québec in 1840. At age 14, she entered the convent of the Marianites of Holy Cross (Saint Laurent). She began teaching and in 1880, founded the Institute of the Little Sisters of the Holy Family, dedicated to the service of priests. She died May 3, 1912. During the course of her life, she oversaw 38 establishments in Québec, Ontario, New Brunswick, Manitoba and the United States.

Wed.May 6, St François de Laval (1623-1708) was the first Bishop of New France, a diocese that included most of what is now Canada, much of upper New England and all the Mississippi Valley, extending even to the Rocky Mountains. He is admired for his pastoral work among the Aboriginal Peoples and the settlers of New France, and for trying to defend Native People from being exploited by merchants and governors through the sale of alcohol. Especially committed to education, he founded both a major and a minor seminary.

Friday May 8, Blessed Catherine of St. Augustine was born on May 3, 1632 in St. Sauveur, Normandy, France. She was a French canoness who was instrumental in the development of the Hôtel Dieu de Québec in service to the colony in New France. She has been beatified by the Catholic Church, declared 'Blessed' in Rome by His Holiness, Pope John Paul II

THE STARTLINGLY GOOD NEWS OF THE RESURRECTION - PART 2

Once we've come to some clarity about the resurrection claim itself, we can begin to see why it still matters so massively. Let us look at the kerygmatic sermon that St. Peter preached in the Jerusalem Temple in the days immediately following Pentecost. Though it flies in the face of our expectations regarding preaching, there is nothing namby-pamby or ingratiating about what Peter tells the crowds. "The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob...has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and denied in Pilate's presence...You denied the Holy and Righteous One and asked that a murderer be released to you. The author of life you put to death." The resurrection is being presented here as an affirmation of Jesus to be sure, but also as a judgment on those who stood opposed to Jesus. St. Peter holds it up as the surest sign possible that God stands athwart the injustice, stupidity, and cruelty of the world and its leaders. If the resurrection is only a bland symbol or a projection of our desires, then tyrants have nothing to fear from it. But if it is a fact of history, an act of the living God in space and time, then sinners have real cause to repent. It is absolutely no accident that the most brutal tyrants of the twentieth century moved quickly to eliminate those who would articulate, in no uncertain terms, the good news of the resurrection. And it is, by the same token, no accident that some of the last century's most effective activists on behalf of justice-Bishop Tutu, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Dorothy Day, and John Paul II-were ardent believers in the resurrection of Jesus. ~ Fr.
