THE SACRED LITURGY THIS WEEK

<u>Wednesday November 16</u>, St. Margaret of Scotland was an English princess whose family fled from William the Conqueror and was shipwrecked off the coast of Scotland. King Malcolm befriended them and was captivated by the beautiful, gracious Margaret. They were married in 1070 (she was age 25). Rough but good-hearted Malcolm saw how wise and virtuous his beloved wife was. He left domestic affairs to her, and often consulted her in state matters. She softened his temper and led him to practice great virtue and charity. Their example ennobled the nobility and she made the court beautiful and civilized. The king and queen prayed together and fed crowds of poor people themselves..

Thursday November 17, St. Elizabeth of Hungary In her short life manifested great love for the poor and suffering that she has become the patroness of Catholic charities and of the Secular Franciscan Order. The daughter of the King of Hungary, Elizabeth chose a life of penance and asceticism when a life of leisure and luxury could easily have been hers. This choice endeared her in the hearts of the common people throughout Europe

<u>Friday November 18, Dedication of the Basilicas of St. Peter & Paul.</u> <u>Saint Peter's Basilica</u> was originally built in 323 by the emperor Constantine. The basilica was constructed over the tomb of Peter the Apostle, the Church's first Pope. After standing for more than a thousand years, Pope Julius II ordered the building to be torn down due to structural concerns. The construction of the new church spanned over 200 years before its completion. It was dedicated on Nov. 18, 1626. It is considered the most famous church in Christendom.


Saint Paul's Basilica is located outside the original walls of Rome. It was also originally built by the emperor Constantine though it was destroyed by fire in 1823. Donations from around the world made the reconstruction possible. Before the completion of Saint Peter's Basilica, St Paul's was the largest church in Rome. The Basilica was built over St. Paul's grave. Pope Pius IX consecrated the Basilica in 1854. These two churches continue to draw millions of faithful pilgrims each year as well as many visitors from other faiths.

ORDINATION TO THE DEACONATE

On Sunday, November 13th, 2016, two brothers, Ryan and Favin Alemao, were ordained as Transitional Deacons for the Archdiocese of Toronto by His Eminence, Thomas Cardinal Collins. The ordination took place at their home parish of St. Francis de Sales, Ajax. A transitional deacon is someone who is preparing for ordination to the priesthood. Before you are ordained a priest, you must be ordained a deacon. Transitional deacons are distinguished from permanent deacons, such as our beloved Deacon Lionel Gomes and Deacon George Jurenas, in the sense that permanent deacons are permitted to be married with families before ordination. Permanent deacons are trained for the specific role of service to the Church and proclaiming the gospel. Those who are ordained transitional deacons are formed and are preparing to later become priests, and they serve as deacons for at least several months before they are ordained priests. At their ordination, they take their vows of celibacy and obedience and they make a promise to pray for the Church particularly in the celebration of the Liturgy of the Hours. Deacons Ryan and Favin now join their classmate, Deacon Jeremias Inoc, who was ordained a transitional deacon several weeks ago in his home parish, St. Mary's in Brampton. They are among four men who hope to be ordained as diocesan priests for the Archdiocese of Toronto in May 2017.

The fourth is Matthew McCarthy, who will be ordained at his home parish of <u>Our Lady of the Airways</u> <u>in Malton</u>. His Eminence, Thomas Cardinal Collins, will ordain Matthew on Saturday, <u>December 17, 2017</u> during the vigil mass in the evening. One of the reasons why His Eminence chooses to ordain transitional deacons in local parishes is to provide the communities with an opportunity to see and experience the Sacrament of Ordination. They are joyful and unfortunately rare opportunities to witness this particular Sacrament of Mission. If you are curious and have never been to an ordination, this is a unique opportunity in our area to see one. The faithful are also invited to attend their priestly ordination at St. Michael's Cathedral Basilica in May 2017.

Please pray for Deacons Jeremias, Ryan and Favin, for their continued formation as well as for Matthew as he prepares for his ordination. Please continue to pray for and support vocations to the priesthood and religious life!


