THE SACRED LITURGY THIS WEEK

Wednesday November 30, St. Andrew, was a fisherman and native of Bethsaida in Galilee and a former disciple of John the Baptist. He was the one who introduced his brother Peter to Jesus, saying, "We have found the Messiah." Overshadowed by his brother, Andrew nevertheless appears again in the Gospels as introducing souls to Christ. After Pentecost, Andrew took up the apostolate on a much wider scale, and is said to have been martyred at Patras in southern Greece on a cross which was in the form of an "X". This type of cross has long been known as "St. Andrew's cross."

Thursday December 3, St. Francis Xavier (1506-1552) was one of the great missionary saints of the Church. Born in the Basque area of Spain he met Ignatius Loyola and became one of the seven who founded the Jesuits. He arrived in Goa, India in 1542 and from there went to Ceylon, the Molucca Islands, the Banda Islands, the Malay Peninsula and Japan. He was admired for his ability to live and work side by side with the poor, to adapt to local mores and his arranging for the translation of religious texts. He traveled to Sancian Island, near Canton, China but was not able to access the mainland because borders had been closed to foreigners. Before he could find a way inside the country, illness incapacitated Xavier. He died on the island on December 3, 1552, at the age of 46. His body was then taken to Goa. St. Francis' body is still incorrupt. Even in death, St. Francis continues to be a missionary!

THE ADVENT WREATH

The symbolism of the Advent wreath is beautiful. The wreath is made of various evergreens, signifying continuous life. The laurel signifies victory over persecution and suffering; pine, holly, and yew, immortality; and cedar, strength and healing. Holly also has a special Christian symbolism: The prickly leaves remind us of the crown of thorns, and one English legend tells of how the cross was made of holly. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life found in Christ. Any pine cones, nuts, or seedpods used to decorate the wreath also symbolize life and resurrection. All together, the wreath of evergreens depicts the immortality of our soul and the new, everlasting life promised to us through Christ, the eternal Word of the Father, who entered our world becoming true man and who was victorious over sin and death through His own passion, death, and resurrection.

The 4 candles represent the 4 Sundays of Advent. A tradition is that each week represents one thousand years, to sum to the 4,000 years from Adam and Eve until the Birth of the Savior. Three candles are purple and one is rose. The purple candles in particular symbolize the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and goods works undertaken at this time. The rose candle is lit on the 3rd (Gaudete) Sunday, when the priest wears rose vestments at Mass; Gaudete Sunday is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when their preparation is now half over and they are close to Christmas. The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of His second coming to judge the living and the dead. The light again signifies Christ, the Light of the world. Some modern day adaptations include a white candle placed in the middle of the wreath, which represents Christ and is lit on Christmas Eve. Another tradition is to replace the three purple and one rose candles with four white candles, which will be lit throughout Christmas season.

In family practice, the Advent wreath is best lit at dinner time after the blessing of the food. On the **First Sunday of Advent**, the father of the family blesses the wreath with a special prayer and continues for each of the days of the first week of Advent. During the **second week of Advent**, the father prays and the oldest child then lights the purple candle from the first week plus one more purple candle. During the **third week of Advent**, the father prays and the mother then lights the two previously lit purple candles plus the rose candle. Finally, the father prays during the **fourth week of Advent** and then the father then lights all of the candles of the wreath.

Since Advent is a time to stir-up our faith in the Lord, the wreath and its prayers provide us a way to augment this special preparation for Christmas. Also this good tradition helps us to remain vigilant in our homes and not lose sight of the true meaning of Christmas.
