THE SACRED LITURGY THIS WEEK

Monday, Sept. 21, St. Matthew, Apostle also known as "Levi" and the "son of Alphaeus" was a tax collector for the Roman occupiers making him un-popular with his fellow Jews. In fact, Jews who held this office were not permitted to marry a Jewish woman nor worship in the synagogue and were generally shunned by civil society. Jesus calls out to Matthew: "Follow me" and he left all his interests to become a disciple of Jesus, embracing his teachings. His understanding and deep belief in Jesus was the impetus for The Gospel according to Matthew. Because of Matthew's duties as a public official, the Church has designated him as the patron saint of civil servants and all who serve government in some capacity.

Wednesday, Sept 23, St. Pio of Pietrelcina (1887-1968) was born in southern Italy into a family of farmers. At 15, he joined the Capuchins and took the name of Pio. On Sept.20, 1918, he had a vision of Jesus after Mass. When it ended, he had the stigmata in his hands, feet and side. Busloads of people soon began coming to see him and he spent most of his time hearing confessions of those who came to see him. In time his confessional ministry would take 10 hours a day; penitents had to take a number so that the situation could be handled. Many of them have said that Padre Pio knew details of their lives that they had never mentioned.

Friday, Sept 26, St. John de Brébeuf & St. Isaac Jogues. The first Jesuit missionaries arrived in Quebec in 1625. At first, they worked among French settlers and traders and began evangelizing native peoples in the vicinity. They soon expanded their missionary work to the Huron tribes about 1,200 km west of Quebec and about 160 km north of present-day Toronto. They visited the scattered tribal villages and were hospitably received by the families among whom they lived. But then the Iroquois, enemies of the Hurons, began attacking supply routes between the mission station and Quebec. During these hostilities eight French missionaries (six of them Jesuits) were martyred by members of the Mohawk and Iroquois between 1642 and 1649.

Love is the measure of our ability to bear crosses, whether great or small. – Saint Teresa of Jesus

In Matthew 16:24, the Lord declares: "If any want to become my followers let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow Me." Jesus invites us to follow Him, to have life from Him -- on His terms. To be a follower, requires that some action be taken. First, to deny oneself is to be willing to set aside selfishness, greed, and yourself as the center of everything, it is about putting trust in God rather than yourself. Jesus models this in the agony in the garden when he says: "...not what I want but what you want." (Mt 26:39)

The second is the action that we must take when we have submitted ourselves to God. We must take up our cross -- a scary concept. Crucifixion was a terrible ordeal and perhaps Matthew uses this image after the fact of Jesus' crucifixion to remind us of that. As a follower of Christ, each of us will bear a different cross composed of difficulties and hurts which we must endure in life. For some, a chronic illness that can be quite serious, and for others it can just be day-to-day annoyances that surround us. Meditating on the Lord's passion and death and referring it to our own pain and frustrations, you should not insist on 'why?' Often there is no answer but faith in God, Who has designed this life as a transition to a better one to come. Suffering has meaning, is redemptive; through suffering we are saved.

All of us are called to exercise this same attitude whenever we find ourselves in leadership, whether that be as leader of a family, a group, a parish, a city, a nation. The ultimate leader - Jesus - modeled this for us and showed us that it would not be easy. For Him, the path to glory involved the cross, because His passion was for justice. He prevailed to rise in glory, but not in the eyes of those who didn't get it. May we learn from him to pursue justice passionately, and may all our actions witness to the same passion for life and dignity and respect that Jesus gave His life for.


