THE SACRED LITURGY THIS WEEK

Tuesday, Sept 29, St. Michael, St. Gabriel, St Raphael. Michael (Who is like God) fights against Satan and his evil angels, and leads God's armies to final victory over the forces of evil. Gabriel (Strength of God) announced to Zachariah the forthcoming birth of John the Baptist, and to Mary, the birth of Jesus. His greeting to the Virgin, "Hail, full of grace," is one of the most familiar and frequent prayers of the Christian people. Raphael (Medicine of God) took care of Tobias through a series of adventures which lead to a threefold happy ending.

Wednesday Sept 30, St. Jerome. Born in present day Croatia. Around age 12, his parents sent him to Rome to study both Greek and Latin where he was baptized at 18. Feeling that God was calling him to use his education to serve the Church, he was ordained a priest. He was papal secretary to Pope Damasus who asked him to translate the Gospels from Greek into Latin, the language of the Church. This translation of the Old and New Testament is called the Vulgate.

Thurs Oct 1. St Thérèse of the Child Jesus. 1873- 1897) also known as 'the Little Flower' entered the convent at the age of 15 and died at age 24. Canonized in 1925, and two years later was declared co-patrons of the missions with St. Francis Xavier. "The little way" is her signature, meaning the simple love from the heart and acceptance in communion with God. Her autobiography, The Story of a Soul, is known around the world.

Friday Oct 2, The Holy Guardian Angels are angels assigned to guide and nurture each human soul. Their role is to represent individuals before God, to watch over them always, to aid their prayer and to present their souls to God at death.

Saturday Oct 3, St. Francis of Assisi (1181-1226) Patron saint of animals and ecology. Francis is one of the most venerated religious figures in history. He lived the high-spirited life typical of a wealthy young man. While going off to war in 1204, he had a vision that directed him back to Assisi, where he lost his taste for his worldly life and soon took up a life of poverty. His life of simplicity and service to the poor and sick, as well as his love of beauty converted many people to the faith.

40 DAYS FORLIFE.

40 Days for Life is a community-based campaign that takes a determined, peaceful approach to show the consequences of abortion in our own neighborhoods, our own friends and families, by drawing attention to the evils of abortion through: <u>prayer/fasting</u>, <u>constant vigil and</u> <u>community outreach</u>. The mission: to turn hearts and minds from a culture of death to a culture of life. The campaign tracks Biblical history where God used 40-day periods to transform individuals, communities, the entire world. From Noah in the flood, to Moses on the mountain, to the disciples after Christ's resurrection, it is clear that God sees the transformative value of His people accepting and meeting a 40-day challenge.

When people think of the abortion issue, they think of confrontation, and we must change that. Instead of seek conversation-and confrontation. ultimately conversion. The pro-life message is one of hope and love. We are called to share that message and present it in a spirit of peace. As Christians, we turn to Christ as our model. The Gospel stories of the woman caught in adultery (Jn. 8) and the Samaritan woman at the well (Jn. 4) are just two examples of how Christ demonstrated love and compassion towards those he encountered. He did not back away from proclaiming the truth, but he was not harsh or hateful in presenting it. We are called to imitate Christ; to allow God to work through us to touch the hearts of those around us - to be the instruments through which He can spread His message - of love, not hate.

Reflection: Living a life of integrity is costly. But at the end of the day, there is great satisfaction in the knowledge that we have done our best no matter what the cost. In the words of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, there are no cheap graces. [Day by Day with St. Joseph] "...Silence in the face of evil is evil itself. God will not hold us guiltless. Not to speak is to speak. Not to act is to act."
