THE SACRED LITURGY THIS WEEK

Thursday, Sept 8th, The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin <u>Mary.</u> Though Scripture does not give an account of Mary's birth; a 2nd Century book records that like many biblical counterparts her parents were infertile but prayed for a child and received the promise of a child that would advance God's plan of salvation for the world. The actual date of Mary's birth was not recorded but, September was considered the beginning of the year and in the Old Roman Ritual there was a blessing of the summer harvest and fall planting of seeds for this day. In celebrating the nativity of Mary, Christians anticipate the Incarnation and birth of her Divine Son, and give honor to the other of Our Lord and Savior.

Friday Sept 9th, *St. Peter Claver*, was born to a prosperous Spanish family and became a Jesuit in 1601. He is the patron of African missions and of interracial justice, due to his work with slaves in Colombia. He would minister to the slaves on the slave ships by giving food and medical care. He gave short instruction in the Catholic faith and baptized as many as he could and prevailed on the slave owners to give humane treatment to fellow Christians.

"BLESSED ARE THE MERCIFUL, FOR THEY SHALL OBTAIN MERCY"

The motto for this Extraordinary Jubilee is "*Merciful like the Father*". The Old Testament uses various terms when it speaks about mercy. Hesed, when applied to God, expresses God's unfailing fidelity to the Covenant with his people whom he loves and forgives forever. Rahamim, can be translated as "*heartfelt mercy*". Love of this kind involves making space for others within ourselves and being able to sympathize, suffer and rejoice with our neighbours.

The scriptural text of Leviticus 5 can help us to understand the meaning of a "jubilee" for the people of Israel. Every fifty years they heard the sounding of a trumpet calling them to celebrate a holy year as a time of reconciliation for everyone. During that time they had to renew their good relations with God, with their neighbours and with creation, all in a spirit of gratuitousness. This fostered, among other things, debt forgiveness, special help for those who had fallen into poverty, an improvement in interpersonal relations and the freeing of slaves.

When the Church proclaims a jubilee in the name of Christ, we are all invited to experience a wonderful time of grace. The Church must offer abundant signs of God's presence and closeness, and reawaken in people's hearts the ability to look to the essentials. In particular, this Holy Year of Mercy is "a time for the Church to rediscover the meaning of the mission entrusted to her by the Lord on the day of Easter: to be a sign and an instrument of the Father's mercy.

The New Testament speaks to us of divine mercy as a synthesis of the work that Jesus came to accomplish in the world in the name of the Father. Our Lord's mercy can be seen especially when he bends down to human misery and shows his compassion for those in need of understanding, healing and forgiveness. Everything in Jesus speaks of mercy. Indeed, he himself is mercy.

PARISH PICNIC


