FLU SEASON

With winter weather now upon us, many people are concerned about the spread of germs. This impacts our celebration of the Eucharist, specifically the exchange of peace which takes place at each Mass.

The pastoral team at Holy Rosary Parish asks you to be respectful and understanding of one another with respect to this matter. While it is customary among cultures in the Western world to exchange a sign of peace by means of shaking hands, this gesture is not mandated by the Roman Missal, which requires that only a sign of peace be exchanged. Some people choose not to shake hands as a precaution against the spread of germs. This choice should be respected, and another sign of peace should be made, such as a simple bow of the head. We are, of course, free to continue exchanging the sign of peace in the customary way, if we so choose. Please be considerate of one another. The spread of germs in the church can also be greatly limited if all ensure that items such as used tissues and napkins are removed and properly disposed of, rather than deposited in the pew-hymnal holders.

*** PARKING ***

In order for emergency vehicles to enter the Marian Courtyard, the Parish Rectory or Holy Rosary School, we must keep the main routes open at all times, including during Mass. There is additional parking behind the Courtyard and in the schoolyard.
