
Sacrament of Marriage

# Desk Scribbles ... 2<sup>nd</sup> Sun Easter ... April 12, 2015 ... Jim Link, CR

## Acts 4:32-35; Ps 118; 1 John 5:1-6; John 20:19-31

This Sunday is the Second Sunday of Easter. Many Catholics will know that since the canonization of the Polish nun St. Faustina Kowalska in 2000 by St. Pope John Paul II it is also designated as Divine Mercy Sunday. Sr. Faustina died in 1938 and she wrote extensively on the subject of her visions and encounters with Jesus who told her that she was to be "an apostle of divine mercy." In a homily one year after he canonized her, John Paul II described how Jesus told Sr. Faustina, "humanity will never find peace until it turns to divine mercy." And in a very real sense this is the gift that the Church receives from the risen Christ and offers to all of humanity. There are many devotions and prayers associated with this celebration including the recitation of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy which you can find on the internet.

The gospel reading this Sunday is one that rings familiar to all of us as it relates the story of "doubting Thomas." Author William Bausch looked at this story with fresh eyes and identified what he called the Thomas Syndrome: "Thomas, called Didimus, one of the Twelve, was not with them with Jesus came" (Once Upon a Gospel, Twenty-Third Pub., New London, Conn." 2008). Where was he? Why was he absent? But he was, and as a result of his absence, he didn't see Jesus or hear him speak or receive his peace. He wasn't there when Jesus breathed forth his Spirit on his own. Therefore, he didn't understand; his faith was shaken. He had nothing to hold onto but his doubt. Bausch goes on to suggest that we too, at times, are absent Thomases. "We are absent from sufficient knowledge about our faith" (op.cit). We forget that our religious formation must be a continuous cradle-to-grave process.

In the many years I was a university chaplain, I encountered this problem of ignorance of lack of sufficient knowledge again and again. People would be vigorous and angrily critical of a church teaching or policy and in questioning them they admitted that they had never actually read the documents, teaching or whatever it was. Their criticism was based on hearsay. Philosopher Søren Kierkegaard once said that you cannot disagree with something until you have understanding; until that point, he said, you simply have misunderstanding.

Thomas did not come to belief because he actually saw Jesus or touched him; no, his faith came as a result of Jesus' challenge to "Believe!" We too can offer that same experience of Jesus-risen to others by the witness of our own belief because resurrection happens whenever love transforms life. Resurrection is happening all around us.
