

# Desk Scribbles . . . 4<sup>th</sup> Sun Ord Time . . . Feb 03, 2013 . . . Jim Link, CR

Jer 1:4-5, 17-19; Ps 71; 1 Cor 12:31-13:13; Luke 4:21-30

A few odds and ends before I begin my reflection his week: First of all, as you read this I will be on vacation until February 12<sup>th</sup>. I am going to visit Hawaii with Fr. Jim Valk, CR who is turning 75 this year. Fr. Jim is staying for a whole month; I wanted to be back before Ash Wednesday. The sun and water and break should be a welcome relief to my hip and knees. Second, Fr. Toby is coming to preach this weekend about the continued need for all of us to work on developing a culture of vocation which allows everyone to be free to respond to God's call of service in whatever way that is. Please welcome him. Third, Maria will be on vacation until next Wednesday but Leah Fuller is covering the office for us. Fr. Michal will be capably on his own; please be kind to him; he celebrates his first anniversary as a priest this Monday, February 4<sup>th</sup>. It has been a busy year for him. And now, to some thoughts about this Sunday's readings . . .

This Sunday's readings present a challenge to us. Jeremiah has come to the understanding that God has called him to be a prophet even before he was formed in the womb; and not only that, his mission was to expand beyond the boundaries of his own people. Jeremiah was called to be a Prophet to the nations. In a similar way, the gospel today can seem hard on the Jewish people who rejected Jesus as their Messiah (after all they thought they knew him "Is not this Joseph's son?") but the truth is, Jesus own mission --- like that of Jeremiah --- was a universal one. God's call of redemption and salvation was for all the world. Luke makes it quite clear that Jesus mission to the gentiles was not an afterthought or Plan B prompted by the rejection of the Jews but was God's intent from the beginning ("and all flesh shall see the salvation of God." Lk 3:6=Isa 40:5).

Our society often promotes a sense of exclusivity and prestige. We move into gated communities that filter out and screen undesirable visitors; we buy a bottle of scotch but wish we could get the 30 year old single malt for ten times the price; we get a platinum credit card and then the company issues a titanium one with even more benefits and status; we gather in our circles of prayer and celebrate our closeness to God but refuse to open the circle to new members. We can easily understand that the Jews would have difficulty in accepting the limitless boundaries of Jesus mission to the world; after all, if everyone is special, if everyone is welcome, what makes us special or different?

Jeremiah and Jesus persisted in their mission in spite of the rejection and hardships they endured. For us, our own experience of religion, of bringing God's universal love to all people cannot be limited by our own small mindedness or need for exclusivity. We need to share what we have received from God and always leave room at the table for others to join us, not in a begrudging way but with warm welcome. Paul's exhortation to love in the second reading describes this very kind of love, a love that is selfless, other-centered, connoting a love and respect for another regardless of shared affection or personal attraction. This is the way God loves and in God there is plenty to go around.

And if we can accept this love of God for us, then we too need to let it shine on everyone we meet.
