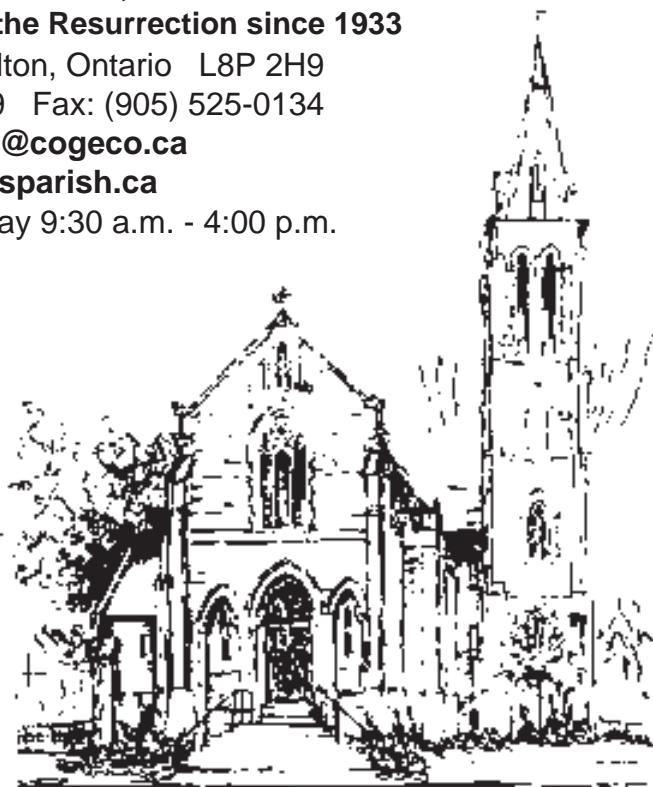

Social Justice: Climate change is an issue of justice

Because carbon emissions are produced mainly by the wealthy countries of the North, yet their effect is felt more acutely by the poor countries of the Global South, climate change is an issue of justice that concerns Development and Peace. As Anglican Archbishop Emeritus of Cape Town, South Africa, Desmond Tutu pointed out, "the world's poor are being harmed through a problem that is not of their making." Canada must assume a significant proportion of global responsibility, as it ranks second globally in terms of its carbon footprint. Canada produces an annual carbon footprint of 20 tonnes per capita – second to only the United States. The New Year is traditionally the time for resolutions, a time to reflect on how we can improve. How can you reduce your carbon footprint? Walking more or taking transit? Supporting local farmers? Refusing to drink bottled water? Wearing a sweater and turning down the heat? Whenever you do these things, you are acting for justice. Think about it.

Desk Scribbles . . . Epiphany . . . January 2nd, 2011 . . . Jim Link, C.R.
Isaiah 60: 1-6; Psalm 72; Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6; Matthew 2:1-12

When Danish philosopher Kierkegaard reflected on the uniquely Matthean narrative of the journey of the magi, he marveled at the motivation of those royal travelers ("Only a Rumor," *Meditations from Kierkegaard*, James Nisbet and Co., London: 1955). The scribes Herod called together were able to explain where the messiah should be born, but that knowledge did not motivate them to join the magi. On the contrary, they were quite unperturbed by the news and had no desire to go to Bethlehem. Similarly, said Kierkegaard, we may know the whole of Christianity but make no movement. The power that forever altered heaven and earth leaves many of us completely unmoved. If God walked into the room when we were watching TV, would we even get up out of our chair?

On the Fourth Sunday of Advent when we gathered in the afternoon for choral evensong with our three choirs singing the "O antiphons," I could not help but reflect during the prayer that none of us really has to look far to discover God's presence or experience how God truly is Emmanuel, "God-with-us." God is bumping into us, soaking us from the inside out, surrounding us, accompanying us, feeding us, consoling us, guiding us when we are wandering, and leading us out of the darkness into light. Perhaps the challenge is recognizing this God-with-us in the very places we move and exist each day instead of thinking that God is somewhere, out there or up there.

The magi set out motivated by stars and dreams. We don't have to go that far. We are constantly tripping over God's presence in the blessings we receive, in the love

that is given and shared, in the bread and wine that is broken and given, in the forgiveness we receive and give to others, in the many events and experiences of our lives that are bubbling and brimming with the Spirit.

Like the light that guided the magi to find the Christ child, there are signs of God's presence, love and Spirit in our own community of St. Joseph's Parish, that shine forth like stars in the sky.

Since my arrival in September 2009, I have been deeply aware of the concern of our parish community for the poor and those who have less. Even in the midst of difficult economic times, our monthly collection for Our Neighbors in Need, has been constantly generous. We are one of the only parishes that give food vouchers cards to those in need to enable them to buy fresh meat, milk or whatever they need. Those who receive this gift are very grateful. This concern for those who are less fortunate is also evidenced in our concern for one another. I have overheard countless remarks of parishioners asking about the welfare, health and well-being of someone who sits near them in the pews or of a neighbor or a loved one. I have heard words of congratulations at baptisms, births, anniversaries, and words of appreciation for a service given or a gift received. I have seen joy in the faces of our children in Sunday liturgy, our choir singing, loving service in a cup of coffee poured at a funeral reception, the face of love in commitments to ministries of singing, ushering, altar serving, reading, giving Holy Communion — all given without thinking of thanks. And there are many, many more.

Who needs to go on a journey to find God? The light of the star has stopped over the corner of Locke and Herkimer. May we have eyes to see.
