

Proverbs 31:10-13,16-18,20,26,28-31; Psalm128; 1 Thess 5:1-6; Matthew 25:14-30

Jean Vanier, Canadian Catholic philosopher, former midshipman in the Canadian navy and son of the 19th Governor General, George Vanier, was so appalled at the treatment of the mentally handicapped in a hospital in France that he invited two of the men to come live with him. In 1964, through Vanier's friendship with a priest named Father Thomas Philippe, he became aware of the plight of thousands of people institutionalized with developmental disabilities. Vanier felt led by God to invite two men, Raphael Simi and Philippe Seux, to leave the institutions where they resided and share their lives with him in a real home in Trosly-Breuil, France. And that was the beginning. The homes of L'Arche number some 130 locations around the world at present and wherever it exists in the world, the goal of L'Arche is to enable people with developmental disabilities to play their full part in their society, helping to make it a more friendly place. L'Arche does this through creating outward facing communities where people with and without disabilities can share life, affirming one another's unique values and gifts.

In one of his books, Jean Vanier describes one of the communities of *L'Arche* and the varying degrees of disabilities and abilities that each of them had in the house. One of the men was fairly severely handicapped but had a wonderful smile that brought joy to those around him. When he didn't smile, Vanier said, it was always a loss for the group. I have always been struck by the lines in Max Erdman's poem, the *Desiderata*, which read: "If you compare yourself with others, you may become vain and bitter; for always there will be greater and lesser persons than yourself. Enjoy your achievements as well as your plans. Keep interested in your own career, however humble; it is a real possession in the changing fortunes of time."

In the first reading this Sunday we are presented with the image of a woman who had utilized her talents to the full. Like a practical Julia Child or a spiritual Martha Stewart, this woman had taken the time and talent God had given her and invested it in life, loving and service. In some ways, it is unfortunate the word "talent" was used in the parable of the coins entrusted to the servants in the Gospel story. We understand the word to mean "an innate ability or "something at which one excels." In Jesus'

time, the word "talent" referred to a huge amount of money, the equivalent of 15 years of wages for an average worker. So, it was as if the master had entrusted his lottery winnings to each of them. No wonder, he was pleased when they increased his money two to five times or that he was displeased with the servant who simply handed his money back to him.

As the liturgical year winds down and we focus on our own end and the end of the world, we need to reflect on the fact that this world and our very lives are on loan from God. When the master returns, there will be a reckoning and each of us will have to give an account of how we have invested what we have been given. So, in many ways, the story of the master and servants is really about us. The talent we have been given may not be money, it may be a simple smile like Jean Vanier's housemate or the industriousness of the woman in our reading from Proverbs. The talent we have been given is our very life, the gift of who we are, of who God made us to be. And we have been told how to make it grow: through loving God and our neighbour. That law of love will be the measuring stick for our investment, for the loan we have been given. This will be made perfectly clear in the judgment scene in next week's Gospel reading. May God help us to use the gifts and talents we have been given for the glory of God and the love of those around us.

LITURGY CHANGES COMING - 6

The words to the Glory to God (*Gloria*) have been significantly altered in English in order to accurately express the Latin text. Before pointing out the changes, it will be helpful to know a bit more about the translation process which took place prior to 1970. The English-speaking Bishops through their international commission (ICEL) worked closely with an ecumenical body, the International Consultation on English Texts (ICET), in order to develop common English liturgical texts which could be used in all the major Christian denominations. As a result, some of the translations were less than accurate, but appealing to all.

The first change we notice in the Glory to God is in the first two lines, which have frequently been used as a sung refrain. The new words are:

Glory to God in the highest,

and on earth peace to people of good will.

The Latin text reads:

Gloria in excelsis Deo

et in terra pax hominibus bonae voluntatis.

The words, *bonae voluntatis*, were omitted in the previous English translation.

The next section of the Glory to God has greatly changed to include every word that is found in the Latin text:

We praise you,

we bless you,

we adore you,

we glorify you,

we give you thanks for your great glory,

Lord God, heavenly King,

O God, almighty Father.

The present English translation abbreviated this text to express the general ideas, but did not faithfully translate the text in its entirety. The result of the new translation is a longer and more complete text. However, it poses challenges for musical settings. There are far too many words to be sung using the existing melodies. For this reason, all parishes will be engaged in learning a new musical setting of the Glory to God.
