THERE HAS TO BE A RESPONSE TO MERCY

What is evangelization? What's all this talk of a New Evangelization? And, why bother! Does it really make a difference if people are Christians or not? These were some of the questions that we pondered two weeks ago at the diocesan Mission with Ralph Martin. Martin cautioned that if we keep doing business as usual, we're going to be out of business.

He shared that there is a core definition of evangelization that helps us decide what to do and how to assess its effectiveness. In Mission of the Redeemer we read: "The proclamation of the Word of God has Christian conversion as its aim – a complete and sincere adherence to Christ and His Gospel through faith. Conversion means accepting by a personal decision the saving sovereignty of Christ and becoming His disciple." This is a very challenging definition. Rather than holding on to our fixation with finding a way to get people to come back to Church or to become more active in the parish, we must recognize that it's possible for people to be coming to Mass and active in the parish and not be converted. People may be active in the parish but never have turned their lives over to Jesus as their Lord, have never decided to turn everything in their lives to His priorities, His teaching, His love, His Spirit.

Some say they're for Jesus, but are not interested in what His Church teaches. In matters that pertain to our salvation what the Church teaches is what Jesus teaches. The Church gets its teaching from the Word of God, from the Apostles, and from Sacred Tradition. Jesus explained the Scriptures to people and the Apostles were eye witnesses to this; they convey that teaching to us.

The Catechism reminds us that: "There are no limits to the Mercy of God, but anyone who deliberately refuses to accept His Mercy by repenting, rejects the forgiveness of his sins and the salvation offered by the Holy Spirit." There has to be a response to Mercy. We have to humble ourselves in saying yes to Jesus.

We don't do it purely in our own strength. We need to have a new Pentecost to empower a new evangelization. We need power from on high, just like the first disciples and apostles needed power from on high. Recent popes have called for both a new evangelization and a new Pentecost.

When Saint John XXIII called the Second Vatican Council, he asked Catholics all over the world to pray that the Lord would renew in our time His signs and wonders as by a new Pentecost. We have enough documents; we need to focus on implementation.

Blessed Paul VI said that the world is calling for evangelizers to speak to it of a God Whom the evangelizers themselves should know and be familiar with as if they could see the invisible, having experiential knowledge of God.

Christians should be able to articulate their personal experience of God. If we don't feel that we can do that yet, we can start by talking with others about their experience of God and relate any parallels in our own lives.

GODPARENTS FOR BAPTISM

Choosing the godfather and the godmother of a child is an important decision. Their role is, with the parents, to present the child for baptism and to help the baptized to lead the Christian life in harmony with baptism and to fulfill faithfully the obligations inherent to it.

We would like to remind people of the following: - according to the <u>Code of Canon Law</u> (the book containing the official laws of the Church)

a child can have: - a godfather and a godmother

- or only one godfather

- or only one godmother

the child \underline{cannot} have two godfathers or two godmothers - also, the godfather or the godmother of a child cannot be changed later on

Conditions to be godfather or godmother:

1. be chosen by the parents (or person who takes their place)

2. be suitable for this role and have the intention of fulfilling it

3. be at least sixteen years of age

4. be a Roman Catholic who has already been confirmed and has received the Holy Eucharist

5. be leading a life of faith in harmony with the role to be undertaken

6. not be under a canonical penalty, whether lawfully imposed or declared (for example, being "excommunicated", having officially renounced one's baptism)

7. not be either the father or the mother of the person to be baptized

N.B.: For a just reason, one may admit:

- as godfather or godmother, an Eastern non-Catholic

- as *witness to the baptism*, a person belonging to a non-Catholic ecclesial community (i.e.: a Protestant, an Anglican)

but <u>only along with</u> a Catholic godparent

A *non-baptized person* cannot be either a *godparent* or a *witness* for a baptism.
