
THE ARCHBISHOP'S EASTER MESSAGE 2017

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Our Easter celebration begins with a proclamation of joy: "Exult, let them exult, the hosts of heaven, exult, let Angel ministers of God exult, let the trumpet of salvation sound aloud our mighty King's triumph!"

God's plan was to rescue people from sin, restoring them to divine friendship. This has taken place in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ! God has come to us in the Incarnate Son to give us hope of eternal life.

Our new life in Christ was proclaimed by the apostles to whom our Risen Lord appeared. Among the eyewitnesses was St. Peter, who said: "God raised Jesus on the third day and allowed Him to appear... to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with Him after He rose from the dead" (Acts 10.40-41).



The Church continues to repeat with amazement the apostles' message that Jesus, the Crucified One, is risen from the dead and remains with His people.

Risen and alive, Jesus comes to us in the Easter Sacrament of Holy Communion. Today in our churches, we recognize Him *"in the breaking of the bread"* (Luke 24.35).

"In the sacrament of the altar, the Lord meets us, men and women created in God's image and likeness (cf. Genesis 1.27) and becomes our companion along the way. In this sacrament, the Lord truly becomes food for us, to satisfy our hunger for truth and freedom" (Benedict XVI, *The Sacrament of Love*, #1-2)

This explains the importance of the Sunday Eucharist in feeding our spiritual life. Our faith is endangered when we lose the desire to share in the Eucharist and to experience at Mass the victory Christ has gained for us. This will be true no matter which form our life as Catholic Christians of Alexandria-Cornwall may take in the future.

Today, as we celebrate our victory with Christ, I invite you to renew your commitment to sharing in Sunday Mass—the little Easter—every Sunday without fail. This is the sure path to the holiness God wishes each of us to have.

May Our Blessed Mother Mary, whose joy in her Son's resurrection we salute in the Regina Caeli prayer, intercede for us and change us from timid souls to disciples of Jesus on fire with a desire to share the Good News with all around us. God bless you and Happy Easter!

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY (APRIL 23)

It is already 16 years ago that St. Pope John Paul established the Feast of Divine Mercy and canonized the little Polish nun, Faustina Kowalska who spent most of her short life drawing peoples' attention to the words told to her by Jesus Himself.

Jesus says: "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls and especially for poor sinners....On that day I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My Mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment...... Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Divine Mercy."

Professor Rozycki who prepared the formal analysis of St. Faustina's writings for her beatification states that "the exceptional grace of Communion on Divine Mercy Sunday is greater than the graces of the other sacraments, except Baptism."

On Sunday afternoon, April 23rd, we will celebrate the "Hour of Mercy" with special guests this year – Keith and Peggy Doucette from the JP II Centre of Divine Mercy - beginning at 3:00 p.m. until approximately 4:30 p.m. (See other details on posters at all of the Church doors.)
