#### **EVANGELIZATION MADE EASY - Part 5**

### **Today's Readings:**

Ezekiel 37:12–14 Psalm 130:1–8 Romans 8:8–11 John 11:1–45 God's Word exhorts us to always have a ready answer for our faith. Can you share our faith in 100 words? Further Reflection from the Catechism:

CCC: 1085–1090 CCCC: 222, 223, 237

#### What is the primary purpose of evangelization:

According to Holy Father Francis in his Apostolic Exhortation The Gospel of Joy #264:

The primary reason for evangelizing is the love of Jesus which we have received, the experience of salvation which urges us to ever greater love of Him.

What kind of love would not feel the need to speak of the beloved, to point Him out, to make Him known? If we do not feel an intense desire to share this love, we need to pray insistently that He will once more touch our hearts. We need to implore His grace daily, asking Him to open our cold hearts and shake up our lukewarm and superficial existence. Standing before Him with open hearts, letting Him look at us, we see that gaze of love which Nathaniel glimpsed on the day when Jesus said to him: "I saw you under the fig tree" (Jn 1:48). How good it is to stand before a crucifix, or on our knees before the Blessed Sacrament, and simply to be in His presence! How much good it does us when He once more touches our lives and impels us to share His new life! What then happens is that "we speak of what we have seen and heard" (1 Jn 1:3).

The best incentive for sharing the Gospel comes from contemplating it with love, lingering over its pages and reading it with the heart. If we approach it in this way, its beauty will amaze and constantly excite us. But if this is to come about, we need to recover a contemplative spirit which can help us to realize ever anew that we have been entrusted with a treasure which makes us more human and helps us to lead a new life. There is nothing more precious which we can give to others.

Does that mean that we are to be Bible thumpers preaching "repent" on street corners? Of course, not. However, it is imperative that we embrace the reality that God invites each and every one of us to share the Good News ... to the ends of the Earth.

A good preparation is to draft a **short testimony**, illustrating an example or two of how God has worked in our life. We've all had such encounters; we need to be able to identify them for our own growth and as a means to help others. Michael Dopp of Mission of the Redeemer Ministries suggests a **four step approach**.

- 1.) Describe what your life was like before (relationship with God & with others.)
- 2.) Describe the event (what happened?) Be clear and specific.
- 3.) Describe what happened afterward (How did God change your life? What does it mean for you today? What is your relationship with God and others like now?
- 4.) Invitation/challenge (Invite the other person to do the same.) Let them know that God is available for them also.)

Michael suggests that, once polished, practice it twice a day for a week, then twice a week for a month, then twice a month ... forever (use it.)

## THE DIGNITY OF THE PERSON REMAINS INTACT EVEN IN THE WEAK AND NEEDY

Vatican City, 9 February 2014 (VIS) – Following the Angelus prayer, Pope Francis recalled that 11 February, the feast of the Virgin of Lourdes, and also the World Day of the Sick, is "a propitious



occasion for placing the sick at the centre of the community", and he asked everyone to pray for them and with them, and to be close to those suffering ill-health. "In particular, let us imitate Jesus' attitude towards the sick, those who suffer from every type of malady: The Lord cares for all, shares in their suffering and opens hearts to hope".

He also gave thanks to all healthcare professionals for their valuable work. "Every day they encounter in the sick not merely bodies marked by fragility, but also people, to whom appropriate attention and responses must be given.

The dignity of the person is never reduced to his or her faculties or capacities, and is no less when that person is weak, disabled or in need of help. I also think of families, where it is normal to care for those who are sick; but at times the situation can become more difficult. ...

Many people write to me, and I would like to assure a prayer to all these families, and I say to them: do not be afraid of fragility! Help each other with love, and you will all be aware of God's consoling presence".
