THE WORD IN LITURGY

Today's passage from the Book of Wisdom personifies wisdom as a woman giving a banquet and inviting guests to partake of it. Wine mixed with fragrant herbs marked special occasions, and meat suggests a festive dinner. The passage conveys the idea of the desirable bounty that wisdom offers to those who answer her call. To grasp the full significance of the passage, however, it is important to remember that in Proverbs folly is also personified as a woman-not a lady, but a harlot. Folly too invites guests to a meal, and does so in a similar manner, but serves only bread and water, rather than the festive wine and meat prepared for wisdom's banquet. In light of these contrasts, the text is also about significant decisions made along the path of life. How we "eat" depends upon whose invitation we choose to accept.

John's Gospel is remarkable in that it makes no mention of the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. Some have speculated that the "bread of life" discourse of John 6 may have originally served this purpose, but was moved up to provide an extended commentary on the miracle of the loaves. Be that as it may, the passage in today's liturgy speaks of the gift of Jesus' flesh and blood as the means of receiving eternal life, and compares Jesus to manna in the desert.


The vivid words of Jesus must have sounded scandalous in a world where cannibalism and the drinking of any kind of blood were completely taboo. But as usual in John's Gospel, the exchange between Jesus and His hearers operates on more than one level. In a Catholic perspective, the way in which Jesus' followers eat His flesh and drink His blood is through consuming the Eucharist, which is truly his flesh and blood, a gift, and the means of attaining everlasting life. The continuing presence of Jesus in the Eucharist is therefore the doctrinal focus of today's catechesis.

THE CONTINUING PRESENCE OF JESUS IN THE EUCHARIST

The Second Vatican Council identified four distinct modes of Christ's Eucharistic presence, declaring: "[Christ] is present in the Sacrifice of the Mass not only in the **person of His minister**...but especially in the Eucharistic species...He is present in **His Word** since it is He Himself Who speaks when the Holy Scriptures are read in Church. Lastly, He is present when the Church prays and sings, for He has promised, "Where two or three are gathered together in My name there am I, in the midst of them" (Matthew 18:20).

This broad appreciation does not lessen the significance given to the bread and wine as the Lord's Body and Blood. Rather, it provides the proper context for this particular mode of presence to be appreciated and understood. The term "transubstantiation" indicates our belief that this bread and wine truly become Jesus' body and blood, and they remain His body and blood even after the Sacramental celebration is over. In addition, Catholics hold that Christ is Sacramentally present under each form. Receiving only the consecrated host or the consecrated wine, it is possible to experience every effect of Eucharistic grace.

4 – The vocation of humanity is to show forth the image of God and to be transformed into the image of the Father's only Son. This vocation takes a personal form since each of us is called to enter into the divine beatitude; it also concerns the human community as a whole.

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OUR LADY UNDOER OF KNOTS

This devotion is more than 300 years old. It began with the great Mission granted to the Blessed Virgin Mary by her Son, Jesus. St. Irenaeus (202 a.d.) originally inspired by a parallel made by St. Paul between Adam & the New Adam (1 Cor. 15:45) made a comparison between Eve and the New Eve, saying "Eve by her disobedience, tied the knot of disgrace for the human race: whereas Mary, by her obedience, undid it".

Why does Pope Francis have a special devotion to Our Lady Undoer of Knots? In 1986, while doing doctoral studies in theology in Freiburg, Germany, Jorge Mario Bergoglio, SJ, saw a painting in the Church of St.Peter in Augsburg, entitled Mary Undoer of Knots.

Impressed by its symbolism & the knots that existed in his own life, he took postcards of the image back to his own province of Argentina, where he introduced & encouraged the devotion. The people were so moved by the image they wanted larger copies made for their local parishes. Eventually, devotion to Mary under this title spread across Latin America. Since his election to the papacy in 2013, Pope Francis brought this devotion to the Vatican, which has caused it to spread like wildfire. On her continuing pilgrimage in our community, the statue of *Our Lady, Undoer of Knots* visited the home of Shirley Belmore on 9 August

ONE OF ONTARIO'S OLDEST CATHOLIC CHURCHES

Forty-five years ago, one of our oldest churches and the original see of the Catholic Church in Upper Canada, *St. Raphael's*, was destroyed by fire. When the fire was finally put out on August 11, 1970, the roof, the steeple tower and all the interior decorations, including a statue of St. Raphael that had come from France in the 1800s, a large hand-carved cross and paintings of the Way of the Cross had been destroyed, all that was left were the stone walls.

Founded by Bishop Alexander Macdonell and built in 1821, St. Raphael's was unique in Canada in that it was built without pillars, instead using solid wooden rafters that were carefully stressed. In addition, wooden pins were used for construction rather than nails. The church which was 80 feet by 250 feet could seat 1000 people.

The parishioners of St Raphael's ultimately decided to preserve what was left of the ruined church and build an unobtrusive modern church against its southwest corner.

Today, the diocese no longer owns the Ruins. However, the Friends of the Ruins (<u>saintraphaelsruins.com</u>) have taken over the preservation of this historical site.

The Ruins are a beautiful piece of both our history and the history of Ontario and were declared a National Historic Site in 1999.
