APPLYING GOD'S WORD TO MY LIFE

Today's Readings:

Isaiah 11:1–10 Psalm 72:1–17 Romans 15:4–9 Matthew 3:1–12 Justice, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit are signs of God's Kingdom in our midst.

SCRIPTURE BACKGROUND

In today's Old Testament reading the prophet Isaiah gives us a beautiful vision of a future filled with justice and peace. The passage begins with the promise of a king with virtues that Christians later identify as "fruit of the Holy Spirit." Justice and freedom for the poor mark the reign of the king and all of creation lives together in peace and harmony.

Christians interpret the promise of a king in the line of David–found in today's Old Testament passage—to refer to the coming of Jesus Christ. We regard Jesus as the king sent to fulfill God's promise to send a Messiah.

In today's Gospel we find a bold and courageous character named John the Baptist. He is determined to prepare the way for the coming of Messiah, Jesus Christ. Out of the wilderness John the Baptist appears wearing clothing of camel's hair. His food is locusts and wild honey. His heart is pure and his preaching changes the hearts of many people.

John announces the coming of a new age when people are called to change their hearts and repent from sin. It is time to prepare for the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. Today's passage focuses on John's preaching which calls for a change of heart and true conversion in order to welcome Jesus and turn back to God. John's mission and message center on Jesus, the coming Messiah, and the moral conversion necessary to prepare for his kingdom of justice and peace.

A KEY THEME:

God is a God of promises. God promised never to abandon us. Catholics believe that throughout history God has worked to bring about our salvation. Starting with God's covenant with Abraham, and then throughout the time of Moses and the prophets, God's promise to send a savior is fulfilled in Jesus Christ.

Jesus Christ is the Saviour Who entered our humanity and our history and brought about the Kingdom of God. The Kingdom of God will come to completion in the final judgment. Justice and peace are the signs of God's kingdom. Through His ministry, Jesus planted the seeds of God's reign. The faithful continue the mission of Jesus and help God's Kingdom to blossom on Earth.

is celebrated on **December 12** every year, on the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe, patroness of the Americas, who appeared to a humble Aztec peasant, Saint Juan Diego, in Mexico in 1531.

The Canadian Catholic Aboriginal Council celebrates this day of prayer, solidarity & reconciliation by issuing an annual message honouring Indigenous people who have been inspired by their Catholic faith.



?EHTSEO EREYA - A DENE PROPHET WHO PREACHED THE GOOD NEWS OF JESUS

Ereya was the original Dene name of the prophet now lovingly known as ?ehtseo (Grandpa) Louis Ayha. Born in 1857, he became known throughout the Northwest Territories as a great spiritual leader. People traveled many miles to visit with him & today they still come to visit his grave. All the elders who knew Ereya talk about how special he was in the eyes of God. The local priests also appreciated his holiness. Fr. Jean Denis, O.M.I., a long-time pastor at Deline parish, was impressed with the holiness of ?ehtseo Ereya's life, his healthy melding of Dene & Catholic spirituality & the positive effect his teaching had on the people. Ereva was raised in Tlicho territory, in the Behchoko area of the Northwest Territories. He traveled with his family around the Sahtu area & built his first log home in what today is called Deline, a community on the shores of Great Bear Lake. He chose this place for its good fishing, hunting and trapping. Later in his life, Ereya said that when he was young he was visited by two angels to share the teachings of the Holy Book. These visits continued for years Once he had grey hair he was told to share his knowledge & speak to Dene people everywhere.

Even though he had no knowledge of written words, he had a rich knowledge of the Bible. He would go from home to home, talking to the people. The Dene people have a tradition of prophets: good people who have some sense of the future & good words of guidance for the people. Ereya is seen as one of the most gifted prophets. He predicted the future for the people and the land. ?ehtseo Ereya would often say, "Remember to always share & to love one another." He also said, "Remember to always keep the words that I taught you. Use them and teach them to each other." He also warned the people about the "yellow poison" that would be mined at Port Radium, also on the shores of Great Bear Lake. Early mining practices were very primitive & many of the miners suffered from exposure to uranium.

?ehtseo Ereya died on 23 Sept, 1940, at the age of 83. Loved and respected by young & old alike because of his strong belief in God, he tried to live out the best of 2 traditions. He prayed with the drum, participated in drum dances, feeding the fire ceremonies and in many ways was fully active in his Dene traditional culture. At the same time he was a faithful Catholic with great respect and love for Jesus, the stories of the Bible and the Sacraments. He encouraged his people to practise both their traditional culture and their Catholic faith. He truly was a holy man.

?Ehtseo Ereya reminds us that the particular spiritual legacy & gifts of our aboriginal brothers and sisters have much to offer our present-day society. He also calls us to respect both Catholic and Indigenous spiritualties and to celebrate what is common between them. As ever, our Church needs good prophets.
