

HOW ENGAGING 1% OF CATHOLICS COULD CHANGE THE WORLD

A KEY THEME: TIME FOR A NEW LEVEL OF THINKING

The tide is going out on Catholicism in [North] America, and business as usual is not going to change the tide. Unless a great Catholic vision emerges for our time, the slow demise will continue. Proverbs 29:18 states clearly, "Where there is no vision, the people will perish." What would it take to make our parish church the one that everyone has come to at least once to check it out?

The book, which was offered to every parishioner at Christmas, explores a number of key concepts: continuous improvement, incremental spirituality, continuous learning, best practices, game changers, personal transformation, "I can do that!", intentionality, engagement and disengagement, meeting people where they are, Win-Build-Send, you get what you measure, the 80/20 principle, and The Four Signs model, to name just a few. These key concepts represent a new level of thinking. They are largely missing from our current approach, and that needs to change.

The Four Signs can manifest themselves in different ways from one person to the next. But imagine for a moment if everyone in our parish did these four things:

- 1.) PRAY (10 minutes a day in prayerful conversation with God)
- **2.) STUDY** (read 5 pages of a great Catholic book each day)
- **3.) GENEROSITY** (gave 1% more of their income to support the mission of the parish)
- 4.) EVANGELIZATION (did one thing each week to share the genius of Catholicism with someone else)

THINKING ABOUT IT

Imagine what would happen if we intentionally

organized everything we do in the church around The Four Signs. Imagine if from cradle to grave we focused on helping Catholics develop The Four Signs.

Are YOU ready to let Jesus take you to the next level in your spiritual life? When enough people answer yes to this question, the Church will again become fresh and vibrant, relevant and invigorated. If we give ourselves generously to the present, God will transform us, and in turn He will use us not only to transform our parish and the Church, but to change the world!

THE DIVISION OF CHRISTIANS MUST STOP

Vatican City, 22 Jan.2014 (VIS) – Pope Francis dedicated the catechesis of his general audience to the Prayer Week for Christian Unity.

This is a time dedicated to prayer for the unity

of all baptised persons, in accordance with Christ's will "that they may all be one". The initiatives, prepared this year by the Churches & Ecclesiastical Communities of Canada, proposed the question posed by St. Paul to the Christians of Corinth: "Is Christ divided?"

"No, Christ is not divided", said the Holy Father. "But we must recognize sincerely, although with suffering, that our communities continue to experience divisions, which are a scandal. There is no other word for it: the divisions between Christians are a scandal".

Evoking the words of St. Paul, he added, "Each one of you is saying, 'I am of Paul', and 'I of Apollos', and 'I of Cephas', and 'I of Christ'. Even those who named Christ as their leader were not applauded by Paul, because they used Christ's name to separate themselves from others within the Christian community. But the name of Christ creates communion & unity, not division! Baptism and the Cross are central elements in our common Christian discipleship. Divisions, on the other hand, weaken the credibility and effectiveness of our commitment to evangelization".

In his Letter, the Apostle rebukes the Corinthians for their divisions, but also gives thanks to the Lord because the community has been enriched in Jesus Christ, "in all speech and all knowledge". "These words are not a simple formality, but rather the sign that first & foremost he sees God's gifts to the community, for which he is sincerely joyful. In spite of the suffering of divisions, which unfortunately persist to this day, we welcome Paul's words as an invitation to rejoice sincerely in the grace conceded by God to other Christians.

We have experienced the same Baptism, the same Holy Spirit has bestowed grace upon us, so let us rejoice!". "It is good to recognize the grace with which God blesses us and moreover, to find in other Christians something which we need, something we can receive as a gift from our brothers and sisters", continued the Bishop of Rome.

The Canadian group which prepared this Prayer Week exhort us to encounter one another to understand what all communities can receive from time to time from the others. This requires something more. It requires humility, reflection and continual conversion. Let us follow this path, praying for Christian unity and an end to this scandal", he concluded.
