#### SCRIPTURE BACKGROUND

The Solemnity of the Epiphany has a rich tradition all around the world. By translating its name epiphania, which means "revelation", we find the rich meaning of today's feast. On this feast we celebrate the revelation of God's saving love in Jesus. The offer of God's salvation is for all people. This is made clear by the presence of the Gentiles found in all of today's readings.

The first reading from the Old Testament reflects the joy felt by the people of Jerusalem after their return from Exile. God's light has come and God's people are delivered. God's saving act is like a beacon of light shining before the entire world, showing the compassion and love of the Lord. Even Gentiles are drawn to God's radiant light, as they stream toward Jerusalem from every corner of the earth.

In today's Gospel the wise men from the east are drawn to the Saviour by the light of a star. These magi are foreigners. They are Gentiles who have not learned about the Law or the Prophets. However, these foreigners find the Christ child and honour Him. The Gospel today shows how the journey of the magi is a journey of faith, guided by the light of God's love. The wise men follow a star, which leads them to Christ the light of salvation.

#### A KEY THEME:

Today's feast of the Epiphany proclaims that God's gift of salvation is for all people. The word Epiphany means to show forth or to make visible. This feast reminds us that Jesus, the Saviour of the world, was made visible to the Magi. Jesus welcomes all those who seek Him.

#### THINKING ABOUT IT

The Catholic Church believes that all are meant to share in God's love. "The Church's essential nature is universal.. preaching the Word of God and proclaiming the Kingdom throughout the whole world" (AG 1).

#### WHY DO WE HAVE MASS INTENTIONS

Even though every Mass is celebrated for the whole community (the living and the dead), sometimes a family may request that special prayers be asked for a particular individual or need. These special prayers are called a Mass Intention. At such a Mass the celebrant not only prays for that particular intention but asks those who are gathered for the celebration to join him in praying for that intention.

Sometimes when a person dies, family members or friends will give what is known as a Mass card in order to show the family their support and prayers in their time of grieving.

The Mass card is more than a sympathy card. It is an ackowledgment that a Christian community will be asked to pray for our loved one who has died.

# THE IMPORTANCE OF THE ELDERLY: THE CHURCH MUST SET AN EXAMPLE TO SOCIETY

which must set an example to society of how they are always important, indeed "indispensable" said Pope Francis, who received in audience the participants in the 28th International Conference of the Pontifical Council for Health Care Workers (Health Care Pastoral). The meeting took place from 21 to 23 Nov. 2013 in the New Synod Hall and examined the theme "The Church at the service of sick elderly people: care for people with neuro-degenerative pathologies".

The elderly "carry with them the memory and the wisdom of life, which they transmit to others, and participate fully in the Church's mission. Let us remember that human life always maintains its value in the eyes of God, far beyond any discriminatory view", emphasised Pope Francis. He went on to mention how the increase in life expectancy throughout the twentieth century has also led a growing number of people to be affected by neuro-degenerative pathologies, which are frequently accompanied by a deterioration in cognitive capacities. These pathologies have an impact on social and health care both in terms of research and in assistance in social and healthcare structures, as well as within the family, which is in need of help and adequate services to care for the elderly.

The Holy Father reiterated the importance of a form of healthcare which "alongside the traditional biomedical model, is enriched by allowing space for dignity and freedom, far from the reclusion and silence that too often surrounds those in the healthcare environment" and, from this perspective, he spoke also of the importance of the religious and spiritual aspect, insisting on the need "to put into practice a particular pastoral approach to accompany the religious life of elderly people with serious degenerative pathologies, with different forms and content, so as not to interrupt the dialogue and relationship of their minds and hearts with God".

"Dear friends", he concluded, addressing the elderly present, "you are not only the recipients of the evangelical message, but also, by virtue of your Baptism, its proclaimers in the fullest sense".
