Today's Readings:

Deut 8:2–3, 14b–16a Psalm 147 1 Corinthians 10:16–17 John 6:51–58 Within the Eucharist, the Spirit of God descends and makes bread and wine into the body and blood of Jesus Christ.

Further Reflection from the Catechism:

CCC: 1373–1379 CCCC: 273, 281 YOUCAT: 216–218

SEE WHO YOU ARE; BECOME WHAT YOU SEE.

The first reading from the Old Testament recalls how God fed the people of Israel. The gift of manna was given to the people of Israel as they traveled in the wilderness. However, the point is made that one can not live on bread alone. The gift of manna is given to the people to help them understand that God's Word is the true source of life. As Israel relied on manna for life in the desert, so the people must depend on the Word of God.

In today's Gospel, Jesus announces the promise of eternal life. Jesus promises living bread that will be life for the world. Jesus Himself is the bread of life. In today's passage Jesus tells His followers that by eating His flesh and drinking His blood, eternal life will be granted. The people of Jesus' time found it difficult to understand what He was saying.

This Gospel reveals that in consuming the bread and wine of the Eucharist the believer is made one with Jesus. Our participation in the Eucharist unites us with Jesus and with one another. When we eat and drink the meal of Eucharist, we show that we are part of the body of Christ, and that we have eternal life from Him.

On this feast of The Body and Blood of Christ we are reminded that "when we eat this bread and drink this cup we proclaim Your death, Lord Jesus, until You come in glory" (Roman Missal, Memorial Acclamation, Eucharistic Prayer). This awesome mystery proclaims that in the sacred meal of Eucharist, although we taste bread and wine, we experience in faith the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

We believe that when the Church gathers to celebrate Eucharist, by the power of the Holy Spirit the bread and wine are changed into the Body and Blood of Christ. Jesus is really present in the Eucharist. Celebrating Eucharist joins us not only to Christ, but also to one another.

The Word in Liturgy

The reverence for the Lord's presence in the Eucharist dates from the earliest generations of Christians, as is clear from the "bread of life" discourse in John and the meal narratives with Eucharistic overtones found in all the Gospels. But it was not until the tenth and eleventh centuries that devotion to the Blessed Sacrament as an object of prayerful adoration developed extensively among the Christian faithful. A feast of the Blessed Sacrament was first celebrated in 1246, and within a hundred years the observance had spread throughout the Christian world. Pope Urban IV commissioned St. Thomas Aquinas in 1264 to compose the formularies for a Mass that he ordered extended to the universal Church. Those texts are still used today as the opening prayer, the prayer over the gifts, and the prayer after Communion in the Roman Missal. [In Holy Eucharist,] Christ, both God and man, makes Himself wholly and entirely present (CCC 1374).

COLF CALLS CHRISTIANS TO BE AUDACIOUS WITNESSES

Euthanasia Is Authorized in Quebec

By a vote of 94 to 22, the members of Québec's National Assembly have adopted the death-dealing Bill 52, somewhat ironically called an "Act respecting end-of-life". June 5, 2014, will now go down as one of the saddest days in the history of "La belle province". Masked as "medical aid in dying", euthanasia is now authorized by law in Québec.

For those citizens who respect the dignity of every human person, from conception to natural death, this event represents a call of unprecedented urgency, a call to take a stand in defense of those groups who will resist and challenge this new law. This is also a strong call to demand quality palliative care for all Quebecers who need to be accompanied with compassion until their natural death. We must always remember that-- even from a narrowly humanistic point of view-- that which is legal is not necessarily moral.

For Christians, walking in the footsteps of the Risen One, who has already won the ultimate victory over all evil – including the evil of euthanasia – this devastating law calls us to become witnesses in word and deed. Like the first Christians, we must be audacious in speaking with our family members, friends and colleagues at work on the subject of euthanasia; we must also make ourselves more available to walk with and support the vulnerable people God places on our path.

Our main inspiration for defending the life and dignity of each person are the words of Jesus: "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me" (Matthew: 25: 40 NRSV).

POPE FRANCIS - "FEAR OF THE LORD"

2014-06-12 Vatican

Pope Francis warned corrupt persons in positions of power that they would do well to fear God's justice and repent, during the course of the catechetical portion of his weekly General Audience, dedicated to the 7th and final of the gifts of the Holy Spirit:

dedicated to the 7th and final of the gifts of the Holy Spirit fear of the Lord.

Departing repeatedly from his prepared text in Italian for emphasis, the Holy Father spoke of the fear of the Lord, not as a servile or supine disposition before the Lord, but as the grateful response of people who have first been loved by the infinite love of God the Father.

"The fear of the Lord is also an alarm," he said. "When a person lives in evil, when one blasphemes against God, when one exploits others, when one tyrannizes, when one lives only for money, vanity, power, pride – the holy fear of God alerts us: be wary!" The Holy Father went on to say, "In this way, you will not be happy, you will end badly." Departing from his prepared remarks, the Holy Father added, "One can take with him to the other side not money, nor power, nor vanity, nor pride: nothing! We can bring the love that God the Father gives us – the caresses of God accepted and received by us with love – and we can bring what we have done for others."

Pope Francis spoke explicitly of people's political responsibility, who allow themselves to be corrupted, as well as of people who make their living from human trafficking and slave labor, and of those who manufacture weapons for fomenting wars. "That the fear of God might make them understand that one day it all ends and that they shall have to give account to God," he prayed.

The Holy Father said that the fear of the Lord is also a kind of alarm for all Christians: awakening us to the presence of sin in our lives and reminding us that we, too, will one day be held accountable to the just Judge. "Let us pray that the fear of God, together with the other gifts of the Holy Spirit, will renew us in faith and constantly remind us that in God alone do we find our ultimate happiness, freedom and fulfilment."
