## CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

This coming Tuesday we will rejoice with second grade students and their families from St. Columban's School, Bishop Macdonell School and the parish program as they prayerfully receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Baptism, Confirmation and First Communion are collectively known as Sacraments of Initiation; they help us to enter into the life of Christ and His Church. Sacraments are special moments of grace – encounters with God Himself – using outward signs to convey interior, otherwise largely unseen realities. God designed Sacraments to be celebrated within the context of the worshipping community.

### IMPORTANT NOTE FOR ALL IN ATTENDANCE

Bishop Marcel, like Bishop Paul-Andre before him, has provided clear parameters for the Confirmation liturgy. In order to help maintain a prayerful atmosphere, the parish has assigned an official photographer experienced in liturgy to document Confirmation. Our photographer will ensure that each family can have access to quality photoghraphs from Confirmation. Prior to the 7 p.m. start time, at a table near the East door, families are welcome to order a \$10 photo package consisting of an 8" x 10" posed photo of the entire group, customized with an inset of their child being anointed by Bishop Marcel with five 4" x 6" photos rounding out the package. This includes your child beng anointed and four photos from the liturgy. Samples from last year will be available for viewing. Immediately after the liturgy, those Confirmed will be invited forward for the official group photo; families and friends are asked to remain in the pews until the photographer has completed his duties. This minimizes distracting the children form looking at the camera and avoids other flashes interfering with the official photo. Then you will be invited forward by the photographer to take any posed photos you wish. There are to be no other photos or video taken until that point after the liturgy. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

#### Pope Francis' Message To The World Economic Forum in Davos, Switzerland – 22 january, 2014

"Ours is a time of notable changes & significant progress in different areas which have important consequences for the life of humanity. In fact, 'we must praise the steps being taken to improve people's welfare in areas such as health care, education & communications' (Evangelii Gaudium, 52), in addition to many

other areas of human activity & we must recognize the fundamental role that modern business activity has had in bringing about these changes, by stimulating & developing the immense resources of human intelligence. Nonetheless, the successes which have been achieved, even if they have reduced poverty for a great number of people, often have led to a widespread social exclusion. Indeed, the majority of men and women of our time still continue to experience daily insecurity, often with dramatic consequences. ".....I wish to emphasize the importance that the various political and economic sectors have in promoting an inclusive approach which takes into consideration the dignity of every human person & the common good. I am referring to a concern that ought to shape every political & economic decision. but which at times seems to be little more than an afterthought. Those working in these sectors have a precise responsibility towards others, particularly those who are most frail, weak & vulnerable. It is intolerable that thousands of people continue to die every day from hunger, even though substantial guantities of food are available & often simply wasted. Likewise, we cannot but be moved by the many refugees seeking minimally dignified living conditions, who not only fail to find hospitality, but often, tragically, perish in moving from place to place. I know that these words are forceful, even dramatic, but they seek both to affirm & challenge the ability of this assembly to make a difference. In fact, those who have demonstrated their aptitude for being innovative & for improving the lives of many people by their ingenuity & professional expertise can further contribute by putting their skills at the service of those who are still living in dire poverty. "What is needed, then, is a renewed, profound & broadened sense of responsibility on the part of all. 'Business is in fact a vocation. & a noble vocation, provided that those engaged in it see themselves challenged by a greater meaning in life' (Evangelii Gaudium, 203). Such men & women are able to serve more effectively the common good & to make the goods of this world more accessible to all. Nevertheless, the growth of equality demands something more than economic growth, even though it presupposes it. It demands first of all 'a transcendent vision of the person' (Benedict XVI, Caritas in Veritate, 11), because 'without the perspective of eternal life, human progress in this world is denied breathingspace' (ibid.). It also calls for decisions, mechanisms & processes directed to a better distribution of wealth, the creation of sources of employment & an integral promotion of the poor which goes beyond a simple welfare mentality." I am convinced that from such an openness to the transcendent a new political & business mentality can take shape, one capable of guiding all economic & financial activity within the horizon of an ethical approach which is truly humane. The international business community can count on many men and women of great personal honesty & integrity, whose work is inspired & guided by high ideals of fairness, generosity & concern for the authentic development of the human family. I urge you to draw upon these great human & moral resources & to take up this challenge with determination & farsightedness. Without ignoring, naturally, the specific scientific and professional requirements of every context. I ask you to ensure that humanity is served by wealth & not ruled by it.
