CELEBRATING FIRST COMMUNION

This weekend we rejoice with our Grade 2 students as they prayerfully receive the Sacrament of First Communion.

Along with Baptism and Confirmation, these Sacraments are collectively known as Sacraments of Initiation; they help us to enter into the life of Christ and His Church. Sacraments are special moments of grace - encounters with God Himself - using outward signs to convey interior, otherwise largely unseen realities.

Baptism is sometimes referred to as "the gate", the normal means by which we become children of God and members of Christ's Church.

In Confirmation God makes us more solid in the faith received at Baptism and empowers and sends us into the world to bring the Good News to others. God knows that we can't live victorious Christian lives on our own, so He offers us the gift of His Spirit so that, by cooperating with His grace, we can be effective witnesses for Him.

In *Holy Eucharist or Holy Communion* we receive an amazing gift – that of the *Real* Presence of Jesus. At every Mass we celebrate this great miracle of water and wine being transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. Eucharist is the source and summit of our life. Attentive participation in Mass, including reception of Eucharist is the main way that we are nourished & grow in the spiritual life. We want to ensure that we approach Holy Communion with due respect by being in a state of grace (no unconfessed serious sin, including having not attended Sunday Mass other than for illness). by clothing ourselves modestly & by not eating or chewing gum during Mass. Non-Catholics and those not practising the faith are invited to approach the Priest or other Minister of Communion with arms crossed in order to receive a blessing. Like all things spiritual, Sacraments bear the greatest fruit in our lives when approached with an attitude of gratitude and openness to God's plan for us. The Church is here to help. but each of us must take some responsibility for our own spiritual health, including regular, active participation at Sunday Mass.

THE KERYGMA (CORE GOSPEL MESSAGE) IN ABOUT 100 WORDS

- 1.) God made us for a loving relationship with Him, giving us free will so that we could freely choose to love Him.
- 2.) Abuse of free will, sin, broke that relationship, creating a humanly unbridgeable gap between us and God for all eternity.
- 3.) Through His passion, death on the Cross and resurrection, Jesus offers us a way to restore that relationship.
- 4.) Restoration is ours if we individually and freely accept Jesus as our Lord and Saviour. Such a decision normally implies Baptism, ongoing discipleship, participation in the worshipping community and bringing the Good News to others, all in the power of God's Spirit.

If we want the real deal and not to simply be going through the motions, we owe it to ourselves to understand the core Gospel message, embrace it and become comfortable in sharing it with a world that is starving for the right spiritual food.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: SACRAMENT OF GOD'S COMPASSION TOWARDS HUMAN SUFFERING

Vatican City, 26 Feb. 2014 (VIS) – Pope Francis continued his catechesis on the Sacraments by speaking about the anointing of the sick, "which allows us to touch with our hands God's compassion for mankind". He explained that in the



past it was referred to as "extreme unction" as it was intended as spiritual consolation when death was imminent. "Speaking of the anointing of the sick helps us to broaden our view of the experience of illness & suffering, in the horizon of God's mercy". The parable of the Good Samaritan clearly expresses the mystery that is celebrated by this Sacrament. "The Samaritan consoles the man who suffers at the side of the road, tending to his wounds with oil & wine. The oil recalls that which is blessed by the Bishop every year, in the Chrism Mass on Holy Thursday, precisely for the anointing of the sick. The wine, instead, is a sign of Christ's love & grace, which flow from His gift of His life for us. The Pope explained that the sick person is finally entrusted to "the Church, the Christian community", to whom "every day the Lord Jesus entrusts those who are afflicted, in body & spirit, so that we may continue to lavish upon them, without measure, all His love and His salvation". "This mandate is confirmed explicitly & precisely in the Epistle of St. James, in which he says, 'Is any among you sick? Let him call upon the elders of the Church, & let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord", continued the Holy Father. "It is therefore a practice that was already in evidence at the time of the Apostles. Indeed, Jesus had taught his disciples to have His same predilection for the sick & the suffer-ing, & transmitted to them the capacity & the task of continuing to give consolation & peace in His name ... through the special grace of this Sacrament. However, this must not lead us to search obsessively for miracles or allow us the presumption of always being able to be healed; it gives us the assurance of Jesus' closeness to the sick & the elderly – as all those above the age of 65 are able to receive this Sacrament – as it is Jesus Himself Who comes towards them". "But when someone is sick and we say, 'Let's call the priest to come', it makes us think that it may bring bad luck, or perhaps the patient will be afraid", he continued. "There is perhaps the idea that when one is sick & the priest arrives, he will be followed by the undertaker. But this is not true! The priest comes to help the sick or the elderly, which is why the visit is so important. It is necessary to call the priest to the home of the sick & to say: 'come, anoint him, bless him'. It is Jesus Himself Who arrives to console the sick, to give him strength, to give him hope, to help him; also to forgive his sins. And this is beautiful! And we must not think of this as a taboo. because it is always good to know that in moments of pain or sickness we are not alone; the priest & those who are present during the anointing of the sick represent, indeed, the entire Christian community who, as a single body, gathers around those who suffer & their relatives, encouraging their faith & hope, & supporting them with prayer & brotherly warmth. But the greatest comfort derives from the fact that it is the Lord Jesus Himself who is made present in the Sacrament; He takes us by the hand and reminds us that we now belong to Him & that nothing – not even sickness or death - can ever separate us from Him".
