#### We are at the beginning of Catholic Education Week 2014

This is a week specially set aside to celebrate our Catholic schools and why the triple connection of home, parish and school is an important and integral part of Catholic education and this triad, this threefold interconnection should help to emphasize for our children, our students, the reality of our wider Catholic community.

The theme for this year's celebration is *Catholic Education: Serving in the Love of Christ.* Our Catholic schools are, by definition, faith-based schools, firmly birthed in the Gospel Values of Jesus Christ. It was this conviction, that at the very beginning of publicly-funded education in the province, that the Catholic population, under the leadership of the Archbishop of Toronto and some very dedicated Catholic trustees, doggedly sustained a fight for the right of Catholics to their own publicly-funded Catholic schools. What we enjoy today is due to a history of sacrifice and determination and the extraordinary work of Bishops, Sisters, Brothers, Priests and lay men and women to build and preserve Catholic education in the face of all forms of opposition, both political and legal.

The challenges to the existence of publicly-funded Catholic education are alive today. In an increasing secular and materialistic Ontario, there are those who see publicly-funded Catholic education as anachronistic and discriminatory. But, Catholic education has contributed very significantly to

Ontario and to Canada in the contributions of all those wonderful graduates of our Catholic system.



This week we continue to celebrate a school system which celebrates and defines itself on Faith in God and the message of salvation for all peoples preached by Jesus.



## SAINT JOHN XXIII AND SAINT JOHN PAUL II



The CCCB joins the Church throughout the world & all people of goodwill in celebrating the canonizations of Saint John XXIII and Saint John Paul II. The two are wonderful models of holiness. By their canonizations they have been recognized as timeless witnesses to the Christian faith. They are examples not only for Catholics but for all humanity – through their radical identification with Christ, their intense life of prayer, their personal dedication to their vocation, the self-sacrificing love they manifested in their ministry, their deep pastoral love for everyone. Both Popes were tremendous leaders of the community of faith, reshaping & transforming the Catholic Church & even all Christianity, while also influencing modern world history.

Pope John XXIII explained his decision to convoke the 2nd Vatican Council with the following words: "In the face of this twofold spectacle – a world which displays a serious state of spiritual poverty and the Church of Christ, still so vibrant with vitality – we ... felt at once the urgent duty to call our children together in order to give the Church the possibility to contribute more effectively to the solutions of the problems of the modern age" (Humanae Salutis, 25 Dec. 1961).

40 years later, as the 3<sup>rd</sup> millennium began, Pope John Paul II encouraged the Church to "go out into the deep" as the Lord has taught (Luke 5.6): "These words ring out for us today & they invite us to remember the past with gratitude, to live the present with enthusiasm & look forward to the future with confidence" (Novo Millennio Ineunte. 6 Jan. 2001).

Both Popes experienced the horrors of war & totalitarianism, but each remained confident new opportunities were emerging to rebuild the world & reconstruct society. Both encouraged social engagement for justice & peace. Both identified urgent moral concerns. John XXIII reminded the world of its need for the Church as "an authoritative voice, the interpreter & champion of the moral order, the defender of the rights & duties of all human beings & of all political communities" (Humanae Salutis). John Paul II prevailed on Church & society to give "due attention to solidarity & the respect owed to every human person" & to bring Christ's "light to bear on a culture which, in an ever more disturbing way, is in danger of losing sight of the very meaning of marriage and the family as an institution" (Novo Millennio Ineunte).

Both Popes called for the renewal of the Church in its loving service to the world, with each appreciating the importance of doctrinal clarity & mutual charity. Each inspired new efforts toward Christian unity & inter-religious dialogue. Each recognized the importance of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vatican Council in order to refocus the Church on its mission & revitalize its members.

Each of these great Popes witnessed to faith in the heavenly Father, inspired hope in the Holy Spirit & showed selfless charity in following in the footsteps of Christ. God calls humanity to holiness & each person to sainthood. John XXIII and John Paul II have been recognized as examples and models for all people. Celebrated as Saints in the Kingdom of God, they continue to intercede for us before the Lord, inspiring each of us in our personal call to be holy as God is holy & to serve as Jesus showed us how to serve. Let us all give thanks to Almighty God for the gift of these two great luminaries

Saint John XXIII and Saint John Paul II, each in his own unique way, provided wisdom in times of darkness. Through their faithfulness to Christ, they encouraged joy and hope. Let us too follow their example and be witnesses of the Gospel to our world.
