### THE CHURCH: BOTH BUILDING & PEOPLE OF GOD

Today we celebrate the Church, of which the church as building is a symbol. We are called to remember our dignity as a temple built of living stones. The Mass is something we celebrate together as Church and as a worshipping assembly united to Christ through the priest. It is not just something we do as individual Christians. In the same manner, our thanksgiving for Mass cannot be reduced to the individual sphere and must be carried out as Church. This collective thanksgiving is done through the priest at the closing prayer to which all respond "Amen."

## What's The Big Deal: Arriving Late for Mass or Leaving Early

Using the analogy of Jesus the Bridegroom and the Church as His spouse, while not as bad as missing Mass needlessly, leaving Mass immediately after receiving Holy Communion is still very disrespectful to our Spouse. Leaving right after Holy Communion: where we have just received the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus, Our Lord, is extremely disrespectful, and suggests to others that we may not believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

We have just received the God of the Universe, the One Who created us, the One Who died on the Cross for us, the Eternal, the Almighty God into our heart and soul and we don't even stop to say a proper "thank you" to our spouse. Can we have a deep personal intimate relationship with the One Who loves us more than we can ever know if we regularly leave as soon as WE get what WE want?


Do we not know that after receiving Holy Communion, we are a walking tabernacle? What can be so important that one would not spend a few moments in thanksgiving for receiving the Almighty God into our very being?

The present Code of Canon Law reads: "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation the faithful are bound to participate in the Mass." It doesn't say part or parts of the Mass. The expectation is that the person will attend a complete Mass. A Catholic Catechism quotes the canon and states, "Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin."

Just as there can be excuses for missing Mass, there could be excuses for coming late or leaving early or missing part of the celebration. A person may feel ill and need to use the restroom. But to sneak a cigarette or step outside because of boredom would hardly be sufficient causes. A traveler may have to make a bus or plane. But to be first out of the parking lot - no! Would we even consider leaving a friend's home immediately after dinner (and even before the other quests are finished)?

While an emergency may demand that a person leave before the end of Mass, one who has departed before Communion and the final blessing can hardly be said to have attended Mass. But the emergency may excuse that person from further effort to stay at Mass. Technically, Mass is finished after the final blessing, but in most parishes it is considered respectful to stay until the recessional is complete.

#### REMEMBRANCE DAY - LEST WE FORGET

(also known as Poppy Day or Armistice Day) is a memorial day observed in Commonwealth countries since the end of World War I to remember the members of their armed forces who have died in the line of duty.

Remembrance Day

Remembrance Day is observed on 11 November to recall the end of hostilities of World War I on that date in 1918. Hostilities formally ended "at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month," in accordance with the Armistice, signed by representatives of Germany and the Entente between 5:12 and 5:20 that morning. ("At the 11th hour" refers to the passing of the 11th hour, or 11 a.m.) World War I officially ended with the signing of the Treaty of Versailles on June 28, 1919. The day was specifically dedicated by King George V on 7 November 1919 as a day of remembrance for members of the armed forces who were killed during World War I. The red remembrance poppy has become a familiar emblem of Remembrance Day due to the poem "In Flanders Fields". These poppies bloomed across some of the worst battlefields of Flanders in World War I, their brilliant red colour an appropriate symbol for the blood spilled in the war.

TODAY, IN A SPECIAL WAY, WE REMEMBER IN PRAYER, AND WITH GRATITUDE ALL MEMBERS OF OUR ARMED FORCES WHO HAVE DIED. MAY THEY REST IN THE PEACE AND LOVE OF THE LORD.
