THE COMMON GOOD VS SIMPLE MAJORITY RULE

In a 2013 article, *Time* magazine posed the question: "Whatever happened to the Common Good?" The article recognized that the concept has its roots in Christianity. The author stated: "The common good is also the best way to find common ground with other people—even with those who don't agree with us or share our politics. Both liberals and conservatives could affirm the moral standard of the common good. And that commitment is especially attractive to young people, who are among the fastest-growing group in surveys who eschew specific religious affiliation."

Commenting on the many economic and social problems that American society confronts, Newsweek columnist Robert J. Samuelson once wrote: "We face a choice between a society where people accept modest sacrifices for a common good or a more contentious society where groups selfishly protect their own benefits."



As Christians, we have a responsibility to always seek the greatest common good for everyone affected.

The common good became a central concept in the modern tradition of Catholic social teaching, beginning with the foundational document, *Rerum novarum*, a papal encyclical by Pope Leo XIII, issued in 1891.

Contemporary Catholic social teaching on the common good is summarized in the 2004 Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church. Quoting Gaudium et spes: "According to its primary and broadly accepted sense, the common good indicates 'the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfilment more fully and more easily"

The Compendium also counters - "[T]he common good [is] the good of all people and of the whole person... The human person cannot find fulfilment in himself, that is, apart from the fact that he exists "with" others and "for" others". "The goal of life in society is in fact the historically attainable common good".


Another relevant document is *Veritatis Splendor*, a papal encyclical by Pope John Paul II. In this letter, Pope John Paul describes the characteristics and virtues that political leadership should require, which are truthfullness, honesty, fairness, temperance and solidarity, given that truth extends from honesty, good faith, and sincerity in general, to agreement with fact or reality in particular.

The Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us: "Democracy must be more than mere majority rule ... History teaches that even democracy ... runs the risk of becoming a tyranny of the majority over a minority. Democracy depends on preconditions that it cannot guarantee in and of itself. That is why Christians in particular must make sure that the values indispensable to a democracy are not undermined." True democracy gives voice to everyone, not just the majority.

When we're making decisions that affect our families, our workplaces, our parishes and society in general, we have a duty to ask:

"Does this serve the common good?"

DEVELOPMENT AND PEACE

Let's make Canada a climate leader!

In December, world leaders will be meeting in Paris at the United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP21) to negotiate a binding and universal agreement on the world's climate. For this agreement to be effective at avoiding future climate-related disasters, the global temperature can't rise more than 2°C over the coming years. In order to achieve this, however, countries like Canada will need to transition to renewable energies and move away from fossil fuels.

Sign a Development and Peace Action Card, which will be distributed on November 28-29 asking the Prime Minister to sign on to an agreement at COP21 that sets the target to keep the rise in temperature below 2°C and to be a leader in achieving that target. On the card, you can also share with the Prime Minister your own personal action to help reduce climate change. The survival of our planet and its people are at stake.

IN THE DIOCESE AND AREA

BISHOP MARCEL DAMPHOUSSE

Last Thursday it was announced that the Holy Father has named our bishop, Marcel Damphousse, as the new bishop of Sault Ste. Marie. He will replace Bishop Plouffe who has been Bishop of the Diocese of Sault Ste-Marie for the past 25 years. Plouffe had submitted his resignation to the Holy Father upon reaching the age of 75, as required by the Code of Canon Law. The Diocese of Sault Ste-Marie, which ncludes the districts of Algoma, Manitoulin Island, Sudbury and West Nipissing, has 96 parishes and missions, with a Catholic population of 206,405 served by 76 diocesan priests. In our diocese of Alexandria-Cornwall there are 56,000 Catholics, 27 parishes and 33 priests.

With Bishop Marcel's arrival in the Diocese of Alexandria-Cornwall just over three years ago, few could have seen this appointment coming so soon.

In speaking with the media, Bishop Marcel shared: "It'll be a shock for many of the people here." "Losing a bishop that they've had for only three years ... all kinds of questions pop up. There's lots of concerns and worries."

The 52 year old Damphousse leaves with many projects on the go including a new evangelization effort to bring back Catholics "who've taken a distance, who haven't necessarily lost their faith, but don't practise as usual....There's lots of work to be done in that regard, I think, of bringing them back to the fold and having them be an important component of the life of the church."

Bishop Marcel remains as Administrator of the Diocese of Alexandria-Cornwall until his departure the first week of January. The inauguration of his pastoral ministry in Sault Ste. Marie will take place on January 13th, 2016. No replacement has been named as yet by the Vatican.
