ADVANCING THE KINGDOM OF GOD

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, Baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

In the above quoted Great Commission, Jesus clearly tells us what is the one reason the Church exists and therefore what is the responsibility of each of us who professes to be a Christian, that is to cooperate in advancing God's Kingdom by Making Disciples (of ourselves and others.) Discipleship was Jesus' method of winning the world to Himself. By looking at Jesus' ministry and the early church, we see that discipleship involves training the disciple in Word, relationship, and ministry. Too often we have focused on the Baptizing and sometimes the teaching (catechizing), but paid little attention to the essential dimension of discipleship/disciple making.

Discipleship is a lifelong process of growing in holiness and of bringing the Good News to others. Discipleship, and evangelization go hand in hand. We don't do it alone. God knows that we can't, so He offers us the power and charisms/gifts of His Holy Spirit and graces through His Church to facilitate that necessary process. God is counting on us to actively pursue this personal growth and in turn to disciple/lead others to Christ. It's not just a job for those in ordained ministry, but for all Baptized Christians.

A KEY THEME: "TO JUDGE THE LIVING AND THE DEAD"

This phrase from the Nicene Creed expresses our Catholic belief that Jesus Christ as our Lord has the right to judge the works and hearts of all. The Church helps us to understand the mystery surrounding the nature of our life after death. We believe that there are two judgments that occur, particular and final.

In **particular judgement**, at the moment of our death Jesus will assign our souls to their final destiny. This judgement is based on what we have done in our lives. Whether we have chosen to cooperate with or reject God's grace. At the particular judgement we either receive heaven, purgatory or hell.

Final judgement refers to the end of time when Christ will return to judge everyone who ever lived. Each person will be judged by the way that he or she has lived the Gospel message to love God and neighbour.


THINKING ABOUT IT

God has created us with the freedom to choose. Sometimes we freely choose to do what we know is against God's will. When we sin we hurt our relationship with God and others. In the Sacrament of Reconciliation we heal and restore our broken relationships. We receive God's forgiveness. In a particular way during the upcoming season of Advent, the Church calls us to sacramental reconciliation.
