*We* are the ones who suffer when we let wealth or work cut us off from other people and remove us from relationship with God. The solution is not to try harder to be good, but to accept God's love; that is, to follow Christ. If we do this, we learn that we can trust God for the things we really need in life, and we don't need to hold on to our possessions and positions for security.
