LOVING GOD & NEIGHBOUR

In today's Old Testament reading the people of Israel are reminded of how God treated them with compassion in their time of need. Now the Israelites need to reach out to others in need. God's people are given instruction to welcome strangers, care for widows and orphans, and show concern for the poor. Concern for the poor and weak is a characteristic of God and God in turn wants His people to be compassionate toward those in need. Jesus in the Gospel will pick up on this teaching by demanding love for one's neighbour.

In today's Gospel Jesus sums up all the teaching of the Law and Prophets in two commandments. A question is put to Jesus about which commandment is most important. Jesus' reply, that first we are to love God, second we are to love our neighbour as we love ourselves, was not a new teaching for the religious leaders. What was new and important was that Jesus presents both commandments as equal in importance. Today's passage stresses that there is no greater commandment than the two great commandments.

A KEY THEME:

Jesus takes what had been two separate commandments and places them together. This new, single and greatest commandment teaches us how to live in the world. The Church believes that love of God and neighbour cannot be separated.

The first part of the great commandment reminds us that God comes first in our lives. We show our love and respect for God in prayer and worship and by the way that we live our lives.

The second part of the great commandment calls us to love one another as God loves us. We show love for others by treating one another with dignity and respect. Catholics understand that we have a responsibility for one another's welfare. The Church teaches that the good of the individual is related to the common good, and working for the common good is based upon respect for the human person. Such respect demands that every person has access to basic necessities, such as food, clothing, housing, freedom, education, family, work, privacy, etc. God calls us to work for the common good and form a society built on love and peace.

THINKING ABOUT IT

The Sacrament of Baptism celebrates our response to God's invitation to believe in Jesus Christ and live the Gospel. As Baptized Christians we are called to live the great commandment and be a sign of God's presence in the world.

PRIESTS PENSION PLAN - COLLECTON 2 NOV. Some highlights provided last year are listed below. We have 29 priests incardinated in our diocese including 2 past bishops and our current bishop.

- 18 of our priests (64%) are over 65 years of age and are currently receiving a pension.

- 4 of the priests incardinated in the diocese are over age 65 and are in charge of one or more parishes.

- 8 of the priests incardinated in the diocese are under age 65 and are in charge of one or more parishes

- Our active priests receive a modest salary of \$34,920. per year from which they pay rent to the parish, maintain an automobile & look after other personal living expenses.

PART OF OUR RICH PARISH HERITAGE

Last Saturday afternoon, a special committee headed by our own Katie Burke-Lynch, hosted a Dedication ceremony in Lamoureux Park, west of the Cornwall Community Museum. Over two years the committee successfully fundraised from more than 100 donors for an eight foot concrete Celtic Cross memorial in honour of the 52 Irish immigrant men, women and children who succombed to Typhus/Dysentery at the 1847 quarantine hospital which had been situated at the foot of Marlborough Street. Many of them are buried in St. Columban's original cemetery immediately east of the present church. Deacon Gordie Bryan presided over the actual dedication and former parishioner Josie Donnelly led the Lord's Prayer in Gaelic. Had the City not agreed to provide a suitable location for the memorial, the Parish Leaders had given approval in principle to host it on the site of our original cemetery.



Thanks to the top notch public health measures put in place by Drs. Bergin and MacDonald and a healthy sense of love of God and neighbour exhibited by many of our parishioners of the day as well as that of the larger community, 182 of the 234 Cornwall refugees of the Great Irish Potato Famine did survive their ordeal.

Cornwall's largest influx of Irish occurred during the construction of the Cornwall Canal from 1834-43. In 1871 Irish immigrants and their descendants comprised 30% of the City's population.
