THE NEW EVANGELIZATION - SIX WEEKS OF DISCOVERY!








Soon, over the course of six sessions, parishioners who enrol will be taking a simple but challenging look at the person of Jesus. We'll cover such themes as love, mercy, forgiveness and salvation. In doing so, our goal is to open up our hearts and minds to a personal encounter with Jesus, seeking to understand more fully Who Jesus is, what He has done, and the invitation He offers for relationship. Relationship in fact is the central theme of the Discovery Study.

We are called to experience God's love through a deep personal relationship. Sin breaks this relationship. The Father's plan is to restore this relationship. Do we recognize Jesus as our Lord,

Who is fully God and fully man, and Who offers each of us the gift of salvation and reconciles our relationship with God. We are invited to respond to this gift of salvation and live in relationship with God. This new relationship with God is not an achievement of perfection, but the context in which we receive God's help and mercy in our daily lives.

In these sessions the Discovery study presents what is known as the "kerygma" of our faith. The Kerygma encompasses four essential Gospel messages. These stated simply are:

- •God is love and desires relationship
- •Sin broke that relationship
- •Jesus restores that relationship
- •We are called to accept this gift

THE ANGELUS

A PRAYER OF PRAISE AND THANKSGIVING

We have recently been reciting the **Angelus** prayer before Mass. For many of us, this may have been a *reintroduction* or continuation of an already familiar devotion much loved by the church. Using words from the Gospel of Ss. Luke and John & other traditional prayers, we give praise & thanks for Jesus' incarnation. Mary's generous "Yes!" to God's invitation to be the mother of his Son opened the way for our salvation: through her, the Promised Word took on our nature, lived, suffered, died and rose again to redeem us. And so, in response to this astonishing generosity, the church pauses not once, but 3 times a day to gratefully remember this cosmic event. The traditional hours for the Angelus are 6 a.m., 12 noon & 6 p.m. (although not at 6 a.m. in deference to our neighbours who may have worked late shifts), to invite us to join with the worldwide church in giving thanks for God's saving love. The bells ring in a pattern for the Angelus: 3 chimes of 3 each, followed by a longer random peal. The prayer traditionally concludes with the doxology, "Glory be to the Father..."

During the Easter season, from Easter Day until Pentecost, the *Angelus* is replaced by the prayer, *O Queen of Heaven rejoice, Alleluia (Regina Caeli).* As we hear the bells, let us make this prayer part of our daily practice.

"And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen His glory, the glory as of a Father's only son, full of grace and truth." John 1: 14 NRSV


