As Catholics, the Paschal Triduum commemorates the passion, death, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Through it, the

> Lord Jesus redeemed the human race and gave perfect glory to the Father. By dying, Christ destroyed our death; by rising, he restored our life. For this reason, the Paschal Triduum is the high point of the Liturgical year.

The Paschal Triduum opens with the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, reaches its climax in the Easter Vigil, and closes with Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday. It is one great Solemn celebration spread out in three days: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and

Easter. It is important that we do our best to participate in all three days.
