### Why six and not two

Every Sunday, our Arts and Environment Committee transform the Cafeteria into our Worship Space. Part of our Altar decor is the images of the Crucified Lord and the Blessed Mother. This arrangement stems from our desire to be formed as a community of faith, committed to the greatest love of Jesus Christ Crucified, and Mary, Mother of Charity at the foot of the Cross. On the altar table, we have six candles, a crucifix facing the priest, and two relics that of St. Magdalen of Canossa and St. Josephine Bakhita.

In the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, "The altar is to be covered with at least one white cloth. In addition, on or next to the altar are to be placed candlesticks with lighted candles: at least two in any celebration, or even four or six, especially for a Sunday Mass or a Holiday of Obligation...(no. 117). We choose six for its symbolism. According to the Book of Genesis,

God created the heavens and the earth in six days and on the seventh he rested. As most of us live busy lives: work, school, and chores; on Sunday we come together to give thanks and to draw from God all the graces that we need each day. When the Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI, was still a cardinal, he suggested that Holy Mass should be celebrated Ad Orientem. By placing the candles and the crucifix on the altar, we create somewhat a liturgical east. For the priest, the Crucifix becomes a constant reminder of the mysteries that he is celebrating. So, the Crucifix must always face him.

At the beginning of Holy Mass, as the General Instruction of the Roman Missal also indicates to us: "On the altar itself may be placed a Book of Gospels distinct from the book of other readings, unless it is carried in the Entrance procession." The Gospel Book is carried when the Deacon is present and when he is not present, it is carried by one of the lectors. The Gospel Book is placed flat on the altar and is brought to the Lectern at the singing of the Alleluia accompanied by two candle bearer for the Proclamation of the Gospel.

# PRAYER GIVES ESSENTIAL MEANING TO OUR DAILY ACTIVITIES

If prayer and the the Word of God do not nourish our spiritual life, we run the risk being suffocated by the many cares and concerns of daily existence. Prayer makes us see reality with new eyes and helps us to find our way in the midst of adversity. These words were pronounced by Benedict XVI in his catechesis during the general audience held in St. Peter's Square.

"Ever since the beginning of her journey the Church has had to face unexpected

situations, new questions and emergencies, to which she has sought to respond in the light of faith, allowing herself to be guided by the Holy Spirit. This was already evident at the time of the Apostles. In the Acts, Luke the Evangelist recounts a serious problem which the first Christian community in Jerusalem had to face and resolve...concerning the pastoral care of charity towards the isolated and the needy. It was not an unimportant issue and risked creating divisions within the Church... what stands out is that, at that moment of pastoral emergency, the Apostles made a distinction. Their primary duty was to announce the Word of God according to the Lord's mandate, but they considered as equally serious the task of making loving provision for their brothers and sisters in situations of need, in order to respond to Jesus' command: love one another as I have loved you." The Apostles made a clear decision: it was not right for them to neglect prayer and preaching, therefore "seven men of good standing were chosen, the Apostles prayed for the strength of the Holy Spirit, then laid their hands upon them that they might dedicate themselves to the diaconate of charity. This decision shows the priority we must give to God and to our relationship with Him in prayer, both as individuals and in the community. If we do not have the capacity to pause and listen to the Lord, to enter into dialogue with Him, we risk becoming ineffectually agitated by problems, difficulties and needs, even those of an ecclesial and pastoral nature."
