FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

God has spoken His word in various ways: in creation, through the prophets, the birth, death, and resurrection of the Son of God, the preaching of the apostles, the scriptures, and the continuing guidance and inspiration of the Holy Spirit in the life of the Church. *In all of these*, the Holy Father points out, *the Church gives voice to her awareness that with Jesus Christ she stands before the definitive word of God: he is "the first and the last" (Rev. 1:17).*

By now, many are starting to decorate their homes with a Nativity creche. The origin of the nativity creche is traced to St. Francis of Assisi, who in 1223 visited the small town of Grecio. Realizing that the chapel was too small for Midnight Mass, St. Francis found a niche in the rock near the town square to set up the But this Midnight Mass would be unlike any other Midnight Mass. St. altar. Bonaventure tells us that St. Francis, after obtaining the necessary permissions, prepared a manger, and brought hay, and an ox and an ass to the place appointed. The brothers were summoned, the people ran together, the forest resounded with their voices, and that venerable night was made glorious by many brilliant lights and sonorous psalms of praise. St. Francis stood before the manger, full of devotion and piety, bathed in tears and radiant with joy. He carried the image of the baby Jesus in his arms as he spoke to the people and tenderly placed it in the manger as if he would awake him from sleep. I suggest that we do the same as we stand before the nativity scene. Pope Benedict XVI in his post synodal exhortation on the Word of God reminds us: The Son himself is the Word, the Logos: the eternal word became small - small enough to fit into a manger. He became a child, so that the word could be grasped by us. Now the word is not simply audible; not only does it have a voice, now the word has a face, one which we can see: that of Jesus of Nazareth.

Prayer for Advent and Christmas

O merciful God, we thank you for Advent and Christmastime, and all that it means to us.

When Jesus, your divine Son, came into this world, He came into a humble home. He had to grow up and learn like any other boy. When He grew to manhood He did always a good day's work as the carpenter in the village shop of Nazareth. He was tempted and grew tired, was hungry and sad, just as we are. For all this we thank you, O Lord.

He was always one in all things with us. He truly shared this life with its struggles and its toils, its sorrows and its joys, its trials and its temptations. He knew what is to live in a home circle, to earn a living, just as we do, to know friendship and the failure of friends, just as we know it. For all this we thank you; for the service of His life, the love of His death and the power of His resurrection.

Grant, O God, that when He comes to us. He may find that there is room in our hearts for Him, that the joy of this season may enter into our hearts and abide there for evermore. Amen.
