

Almsgiving was a n acknowledgement that whatever benefits I receive from this world belong to evervone. In fact, Blessed John Paul II reminded us about this as the fundamental doctrine for the Social Teachings of the Church. give to the poor not as charity, but as recognition that if I have more than I need, it belongs to someone else. Almsgiving is distributive justice, a way of

leveling out our surplus and need among all those who have equal rights to the gifts of this world.

Prayer is my openness to God as teacher and Lord. God wants us to grow and if we are open we will also be led. Let us strive, therefore, to listen hard, try to see in God in each day's issues, especially in the relationships that we most take for granted. Let us also pay attention, to hear what others are saying about me, calling me to be.

Fasting, like almsgiving, is a reminder that if I take too much, others suffer. One of my first cultural shocks when I first arrived in Canada was the size of the food serving in the restaurants. Whenever we ate as a family at home, food was always placed on a serving platter. Each one has his own small plate. Everyone at the table serve themselves by taking food from this serving platter. In Canada, the serving platter becomes your plate. No wonder, most of us have difficulties controlling our body weight.

Fasting is also about alertness and self-knowledge. Thomas Merton once connected a piece of bread to the earth that produced it, the farmer who grew the wheat, the elevator that stored it, the train that shipped it, the baker who baked it, the truck driver who delivered it, the store manager who offered it - in other words, to the entire network of interdependence we rely on for survival. In fact, every time we begin our day, the moment we prepare or buy coffee with sugar and cream, we are connected to Central America, with multinationals, labor practices, survival. Fasting is about being alert to justice and injustice as inescapable issues.

As we enter this season of grace, may these thoughts guide us in our practice of the disciplines of Lent.
