

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The whole Church celebrates today the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. The feast that commemorates the visit of the wise men to the Christ child in Bethlehem. On Christmas eve, a light was shone in the darkness of this world. It first illuminated the stable in Bethlehem and then in the fields, among the shepherds, who were grazing their sheep. This light eventually illuminated the whole earth symbolized by the arrival of the wise men from the east. This light is no other than God himself, who became flesh, born of the Virgin Mary. St. John writes in his First letter that "God is light; in him there is no darkness and further on, he also declares that "God is love". The light that illuminated the world is God's love manifested in Jesus Christ. Like the various personalities of the Bethlehem story, may we too, be attracted by this light and experience in a deep way the love of God.

I would like to take this occasion to thank all of you for participating in the formation of our parish community. In spite of their great learning and status in the world, they bowed before the Christ child laying in the manger, offering their precious and symbolic gifts, the gift of themselves.

- Praying for the poor, the homeless, for an end to sweatshops, etc.

# Education

We are obligated to educate ourselves and others about social justice. Read all you can about the subject. Study all you can about all the social issues facing us. Spread the word about these issues. Examples: global warming, the natural disasters, sweatshops, oppressed and persecuted Christians, etc.

# **Community Organizing**

Get involved in the community! Join or start a food pantry. Start a neighborhood watch program if one is needed. Start or join a group in the parish that studies the issues of the community/word and decides what can be done about the problems facing us. Join our Parish Social Concerns...

# Advocacy

This is giving a voice to those who have no voice, that is, the poor, the sick, the shut in, the unborn, the dying, the disadvantaged, the immigrants, those imprisoned, the homeless, racial minorities, etc. We are called to speak out! Write a letter to the editor, join a march, call your elected officials and let them know how you feel.

The feast of our newest Canadian Saint, St. Brother Andre Bessette will be celebrated on Thursday, January 6. Brother Andre was born in Quebec and joined the Congregation of the Holy Cross in 1872 (the congregation did not want to accept him, because of his frail health, but the bishop insisted: "I am sending you a saint"). He had great confidence in Saint Joseph and recommended prayer to him to all who were sick. So many were cured that Brother Andre himself was acclaimed as a miracleworker, and when he died on January 6, 1937, a million people filed past his coffin. He was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 17, 2010.
