Lent is more discipline than denial. And that discipline is more growth-producing and life-changing if it is positive. It can take the form of evaluating where each of us "is" in our life at this time and coming up with some ideas of what we would like to change in order to make ourselves better persons.

Some examples children might come up with at first are: I could be nicer to my brothers and sisters; I could help out around the house more; I could study harder; I could do what I am told the first time Mom or Dad asks; I could be more pleasant in the mornings.

To broaden their awareness, you could ask if there is someone they know who could really use their help, or who needs a friend. Help them to set some goals for whatever they choose to work on. It can be as simple as smiling and saying something nice to the person who needs a friend each time they see each other. Or he or she can resolve to do one nice thing for another person each day. Keep it simple and do-able.

Periodic interest and evaluation are also a help. Once in awhile or routinely, whichever works best, ask if the family member has been able to keep their resolutions and help them to see how it is helping them to grow by asking what they have learned so far from the experience. It is also extremely valuable for parents to share their experience as well. The adage that the most important things in life are "caught, not taught" is fundamental in teaching values.

Home is the primary teaching environment, whether it is conscious or unconscious. Life-lessons will be "caught" every day, and it is so important that the direction of those lessons be on a conscious level. Communication is the key, and it can be done simply by ordinary interest in what is happening within the life of the child and helping them to evaluate their experiences and growth. A helpful question, whether it gets a response or not, is "What have you learned from this experience?" The answer may not be there at first, but it will at least prompt some thought. Your recognition of the fact that they cannot always answer immediately can open the door for discussion later on after they have had a chance to think about it, if they choose. Talking reinforces leaning experiences, but for some it is enough to ask the question and let it sit.

Again, the important thing is to do something this Lent to be a better person ourselves, to be the kind of person God wants us to be, and to make the world a better place because of our life within it.

So...what are you going to do for Lent?

O God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit, we may ever know what is right, and ever rejoice in His consolation, through Christ our Lord. Amen.
