Pastor's Desk

I started to write this bulletin on a fifteen hour flight from Toronto across the Pacific Ocean into Taiwan. The plane left Toronto on time at 1:30 AM, a good time to fly. Once airborne and after a hearty meal of lamb chops, it was time to sleep. I must have slept like a baby...for seven hours straight without interruption...that leaves me another seven hours to work and pray. God's gift. Most of the passengers around me are sleeping. There is very little movement in the cabin except for the occasional flight attendant. I suppose for a long flight like this, people force themselves to sleep, so as to make the trip bearable. It is not easy to sit that long especially for someone like me whose tailbone was broken awhile back and nothing can be done about it except to allow the human body to heal itself.

I brought with me a digital copy of the book entitled *Mastering Sadhana: a retreat with Anthony de Mello*, a book I have read many years ago when I was still a seminarian. After twenty years of being a priest, I thought of revisiting some of the things that gave me peace and balance. I was very young then, only twenty-one. I wonder what new perspectives this book would unfold for me now that I am forty-eight in a couple of weeks.

I remember when I was about 12 years old, I used to wonder what it feels like to be older, about four or five years older...and now, I am forty-eight and I wonder, my God, where have all the years gone by. Time flew so quickly.

It is now eleven hours since we left Toronto. I wonder how the parish is doing. The 11 AM Mass was probably just ended, people are leaving the parking lot, and the preparation for the 12:30 PM Mass must be underway. I already miss the parish. The flight attendant just brought me dimsum and green tea, but there is a bit of turbulence. All these years of flying and fear still grips my hear when this things occurs... and I can't but call on God or any angel and saint to assist. I suppose I have to learn to trust God more...easier to say than do, I must tell you.

Thank God, the turbulence has calmed down. I wonder how the parish is managing without me. I feel like the parent, who can't keep still without knowing his kids are ok. I remember my uncle Octavio advise many years ago: "learn to cut the umbilical cord..." I suppose that is what I should do... stop worrying.

It is now 1:15 PM Toronto time. It must be communion time at the parish. Gracious Lord, although I cannot receive you now in the Eucharist, I join with my brothers and sisters in welcoming you into our lives. In honour of your divine mercy, grant us the grace to have an abiding and trusting faith. May we, as a parish community, continue to be shaped in the hope that saves with Blessed Mary, Mother of Charity under the foot of the Cross. Amen.
