From the Pastor's Desk

As I prepared this Bulletin, our pilgrim group has arrived in Jerusalem. On Tuesday, we visited the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem. One interesting feature of the old church is its very low entrance that forces the person who wish to enter to bend and pay homage. It is there to remind the pilgrim that Jesus, though he was divine, humbled himself to become one of us. On Wednesday, we will begin the day with a Holy Mass at the Garden of Gethsemane, where our Lord spent his last hours before he was condemned to die on a cross. From here, we will retrace his steps as he enters the old city gate. On our way, we will visit the chapel of the Betrayal, the tomb of the Blessed Mother, the place where the first Christian martyr, Stephen, was stoned to death. We will enter St. Stephen's gate and enter the Church of St. Ann. Beside this crusader church is the pool of Bethesda then to the western wall of the Temple (also called the Wailing Wall), through the streets of Old Jerusalem and eventually the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. As we enter the door of Christianity's most holy site, we will climb some stairs to bring us to Mount Calvary, then down to the place where they laid him as the disciples removed Him from the cross and prepared Him for burial. We would then pass through a narrow passageway leading into the place where Jesus was buried and risen from the dead.

As we retrace the steps of Jesus, we carry with us your petitions as we have done so throughout this journey.

It is hard to describe the various emotions that were evoked in us as we traveled through the land of Jesus. When we were in a boat in the Sea of Galilee, our group spontaneously danced. When we were in Gethsemane, tears flowed from our eyes. What a wonderful grace we have received these last few days. An interesting feature of our pilgrimage is the person of St. Therese. It seems that the saint was helping us make this pilgrimage. We saw her picture in unexpected places: on a street in Cana and on the main altar of the chapel where we celebrated the Holy Mass on Mt. Carmel in Haifa.

God willing, we will be back in Toronto on Monday, November 21. Please pray that we may have a safe journey home. If you wish to see some of the pictures we have taken, you may visit our parish website.

The Season of Advent is a time of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of the birthday of the Savior. The progression of the season is marked by the lighting of the Advent Candles arranged in an evergreen wreath to symbolize the eternal cycle of the seasons and the persistence of life in the midst of winter. There are four candles to represent the four weeks - the three candles are colored purple and one is colored rose or pink. The rose colored candle is lighted on the third Sunday to symbolize the joy and the excitement that are welling up within us as we draw near to Christmas. In some Advent wreath, a fifth candle is added. A white candle to symbolize Christ



and it is lighted on Christmas eve. The custom is observed both in family setting and at church services.
