FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

We are celebrating this Sunday the Feast of Christ the King. It is the last Sunday of our Liturgical Year. The feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 in order to remind the world of Christ's authority in a world that was increasingly becoming secularistic. The pope at that time hoped that the feast would strengthen and encourage the people of God, bring freedom to the Church, and above all, respect to our Lord Jesus Christ.

The world seems to be in a downward spiral. Many people put the individual self as the sole authority. The idea that Christ is King conflicts with the prevailing reality. Some people do not like this title because they associate it with oppressive regimes, but they forget that the kingship of Christ is marked by humility and service. Our Lord himself has said: "You know that those who are recognized as rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones make their authority over them felt. But it shall not be so among you. Rather, whoever wishes to become great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many (Mark 10:42-45).

Christ's kingship is also characterized by suffering and death. While we are reminded on this feast of Christ coming in glory to judge the living and the dead, we are not oblivious to what he has taught that His Kingdom of justice and judgment is balanced by charity, mercy, peace, and forgiveness. To commemorate this feast then is to mark Christ's willingness to give his life for all .

As we enter into the new Liturgical Year, beginning with the First Sunday of Advent, I wish to suggest to all of you to read the post-synodal reflection on the Word of God in the life and mission of the Church that the Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI wrote and published on September 30, 2010. You can download the document in English, French, German, Italian, Latin, Polish, Portuguese, and Spanish at the Vatican website (http://www.vatican.va). The document is the fruit of the twelfth Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, which was held in Rome from October 5 to 26, 2008. In it, the Holy Father highlights both "the fundamental role of God the Father, source and origin of the Word", and "the Trinitarian dimension of revelation." God has chosen to speak to us and it is appropriate that we respond to Him in faith and the wonderful thing is that God Himself has supplied us with the words to respond to Him: the words that are conserver and written in the Bible, particularly in the Book of The Holy Father also speaks on how the Scriptures are to be interpreted and its link with the sacraments, especially the Eucharist. He also reminds us of the importance of biblical inspiration for pastoral activity, catechesis, and formation of Christians. Emphasis is also given to lectio divina and Marian prayer. Furthermore, the Holy Father also draws our attention to task of announcing the Word in the world in which we live and work; to commit ourselves to the promotion of reconciliation, justice, and peace among peoples. Having spoken thus, our Holy Father concludes by exhorting all Christians "to become increasingly familiar with Sacred Scripture". Throughout the four weeks of the Season of Advent, I will try to unpack this important document for you. I also intend to use this synodal reflection as the basis for our reflection during the nine-day immediate preparation to Christmas.

We pray for the repose of the souls of all those killed in the attack on the Syriac Catholic Church in Baghdad during Sunday Mass. May our global family support the suffering Christians of the Middle East so that they may be protected and free to practice their faith in peace.
