From the Pastor's Desk

Gather all and immerse them in the depths of my mercy

I was glad that our pilgrimage started at the Convent of our Lady of Mercy in Krakow where St. Faustina died. At the Convent, we celebrated Holy Mass right beside the relics of the saint. The message of the Lord to Sister Faustina fixed the tone of our pilgrimage from beginning to end. The message of mercy became even clearer for us when we visited the concentration and extermination camps of Auschwitz and Birkenau. How is it possible that man can descend to such abyss? The evil that human beings inflicted on their fellow human being boggles the mind. It deeply affected me when I noticed the proximity of the building that the Nazi used for their socialization and the gas chamber. How can they party and not hear the cries and screams of those who were being poisoned? What hatred has been unleashed!

It was difficult to walk through the camps. We entered the gates in laughter and we emerged from it in shock and silence. We came face to face with evil. But amidst the horror and inhumanity, we also saw a glimmer of hope. In the cell where Maximilian Kolbe died, a paschal candle, left by the pope to mark his visit, signalled this hope.

I recalled the words of Dr. Viktor Frankl, who wrote about his prison experiences in the concentration camp. He said that one should always try to find meaning despite the horror, suffering, and indignities that we experience each day. One must find hope even if it is faint or wavering.

Mercy, Despair, Hope. This was the sequence of our pilgrimage. We heard the message of mercy. We descended into hell and saw how humanity has suffered. But, Hell is not the last word. It can never be. Hope is our salvation. Only through it that true freedom is possible.

Sacramental Preparation First Reconciliation, First Communion, Confirmation

Visit of Sr. Anne Bosio, Fdcc

Sr. Anne Bosio, the Provincial Superior of the Canossian Sisters will be in St. Josephine Bakhita Parish on October 21 to 27, to visit the Sisters, Fr. Mark and our parish community. This is Sr. Anne's second visit here since our parish was established. Kindly accord her a warm welcome at this weekend's Masses.

Refugees and Migrants

As a result of war, violence, famine and natural disasters, one in every 300 persons in the world is an international refugee - 20.6 million. Another 25 million are internally displaced persons, often unable to leave situations of war and violence (UNDP, HDR 2002 p. 16). Half of the world's refugees are children. Many refugee camps are in poor condition and unprotected from violence.

As of 2003, 175 million people reside outside of their country of birth - an all time high and double that of a generation ago. Most migrants seek employment and education in the hope of better lives, but are often met with resistance and restrictive immigration laws. Immigrants today tend to be less educated and lower skilled that the populations of their receiving countries, and do not find access to the opportunities they expected. Cultural and ethnic tension increases, eruptina at times into violent conflict. Nonetheless, the vast majority of immigrants are making contributions to their host countries, often working in sectors in which locals will not. Many risk being exploited as cheap labour, and slavery-like some in situations. Other immigrants are highly skilled professionals - the loss of human resources in their countries of origin is a very serious consequence.

Thanks to the parishioners who participated at the Iraqi refugees crisis information night on Thursday, October 21. We will continue this conversation, and hope that we will be helped in our discernment process as a parish community, regarding this important and urgent issue. Our Parish Social Concerns Ministry will host future follow-up meetings. Please see the bulletin for announcements to this effect. Thank you.
