FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I had the opportunity this week to see two movies. The first was "Bless You Prison" and the second was "The Courageous Heart of Irena Sendler". "Bless You Prison" was about the Romanian Nicoleta Valery Grossu, who was imprisoned by the Communist because of her political beliefs and found God and survived despite the horrible cruelty that she was subjected to. "The Courageous Heart of Irena Sendler" was about a Polish Catholic social worker who in the early days of World War II devised a daring plan to rescue Jewish children from the ghetto.

When Nicolata Valery Grossu was arrested, tortured, and thrown into solitary confinement, she narrates that her mother was a very religious person and used to read to her as a young girl the Book of Psalms. But when she became older, like many of her peers, never thought about God until she found herself in prison. As she languished in jail and badly beaten, she recalled those Bible passages that her mother used to read and with a plum seed, she scribbled them on the wall. These passages comforted, strengthened, and kept her going until she gained her freedom many years later. "Bless you Prison," she exclaimed, because the prison became for her a place of grace.

Irena Sendler, on the other hand, tells us about an instance when she was debating whether to help the children or not. She recalled what her father had said to her as a child: "When you see a person drowning, try to rescue him even if you do not know how to swim." With these words, she disguised herself as a nurse and together with her colleagues, gained access to the Jewish ghetto in Warsaw and, one by one, smuggled some 2,500 children to safety by putting them up with Polish families who were willing to help or placed them in convents and orphanages.

The formative years of a child are crucial. The values that we instill in them will shape their future. I have met many parents who despair about their children, who seem to have forgotten the values that their parents have diligently and carefully fostered. Their parents have brought them to church and taught them to revere God, and now, that they have become adults, they rarely, if not never, warm the pews of the church.

I believe that the grace of God will never go to waste. It is like rain that waters the field and in due season will produce a good harvest. Nicoleta found God while in prison because her mother took the time to read to her as a little girl the Bible. Irena saved many children because her father provided her with a shining example to imitate. When Irena was young, her father, who was a medical doctor, took care of those who became sick of typhus, at a time when many doctors refused these poor victims medical help. Eventually, her father succumbed to the disease and died.

Parents must do whatever they can to raise their children in the ways of faith. As a parish community, we must do whatever we can to welcome the children and assist them to become active participants of the Christian community. This is a duty we should not remiss. We do not see the fruit now, but I am certain there will be. Several years ago, in one of my former parishes, I saw a young woman crying in church one day. I approached her to see what was wrong. Then, she told me her story. She was HIV positive. As a young girl, she attended the Catholic school next door. She recalled that her school community would come to the Church and attend Mass. Later on, she moved to another school in another community, and never stepped into a church again, until that morning I met her. In her moment of crisis, she retraced her steps, visited the only church she attended as a child, and sought God. I have never forgotten her. I am sure God has not forgotten her either.
