Please welcome Sister Necy Guan, Fdcc from Cristo Rey Province - North America of the Canossian Daughters of Charity. Sister Necy takes on the role as Pastoral Assistant for the formation of our children and Youth. Sr. Necy Guan has been a religious for thirty-three (33) years. She obtained her Masters Degree in Education with specialization in Guidance and Counseling from De la Salle University, Philippines and Master in Pastoral Studies from Loyola University of Chicago, USA. She also has a training in Spiritual Direction from Mercy Center, Colorado Springs, CO, USA. She had been in school ministry in the Philippines and varied church ministries in the United States.
