PROMPT, PROVIDE, PROMISE

Three things that Jesus said in the Gospel stood out to me. He first prompts us to consider what we love most; He then provides comfort for us when we lose sight of those things; And finally, He promises us great joy in the time to come.

Jesus immediately prompts us when He says, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." It's almost as if he's looking at me and earnestly asking, What do you value most, Leanna? What is it that captures you? What do you love the best; what do you think about most often? In my heart of hearts, what I desire most is quality family time, provocative conversation, surprising adventures, authentic laughter, good art. We all have the things we strive to experience, and serve and honour others, to live in the spirit of God.

But I confess that I sometimes allow fear to infiltrate my heart of hearts. It's a familiar feeling for us all: a fear of losing something you care deeply about. It's only natural to feel this way when we are business

owners, students, law enforcement officers, not-forprofit workers, parents, spouses... anyone with responsibility, investments, or something to lose, feels this occasionally (if not often).

It is normal to have fear creep in. But fear has its place as an occasional visitor, not a permanent resident. If we allow fear to remain in us, it becomes the 'treasure' where our hearts lie instead of what we love most. It can happen without us even realizing it. Soon, our hearts will be transformed into places of worry, regret or defensiveness, rather than openness, delight, excitement, awe.

In these times we allow fear to stay passed its welcome, Jesus provides comfort for us, "Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the Kingdom." It's as if He's saying, Don't worry, I will take care of you. I am with you.

In fact, He promises "an unfailing treasure in Heaven awaits"! To be free of fear that can overtake our hearts, this is when we can truly surrender and entrust our hearts to Jesus. In his promises to us, that fear is finite and his love is eternal! If He holds our hearts, He will prompt us, provide for us, and promise us, and we have nothing to fear for long.

Taken from the *Toronto Mirror*, Friday, September 19, 1856: "On Saturday last, the 14th instant, an important event occured in our civic history, the opening of one of the finest collegiate churches in North America, destined...to be a haven of the Faith whence the angelic messengers of God will go..." CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS!

In these slower days of summer, our construction crew has been very busy in our spaces downstairs. I am happy to report that demolition is now complete and that no serious issues were found. Praise be to God that our ancestors were incredibly thoughtful when they constructed this building, and we are taking every measure to continue this tradition. Over the past month, we have taken some extra time to consult with structural engineers and historical experts to ensure that this project preserves all of the important aspects of the building, especially while we can see the "bones" of the structure. In the next week or two, we will begin new construction as designed. (Again, you can see those designs http://stbasiltoronto.org/building-improvements/). We are being told that the parish hall space will be available mid-late September and the South Hall space will be available mid-late October.

In the church, we will be installing new ceiling fans in the next week or two. After a great deal of consultation, we are installing these fans in hopes that they will help keep the building cooler in the summer and save energy in the winter. While we are still waiting to receive clearance from the historical society for air conditioning, it will be very interesting for all of us to see how these fans perform in the tail end of the summer.
