HOPE IN PROVIDENCE

If this were not a Sunday, the liturgical calendar would celebrate the Feast of St. Anne. Nevertheless, much of today's readings could be interpreted as more than appropriate in considering the female lineage of Jesus' earthly family.

Feeding is one of the themes. Throughout the ages, and in virtually all cultures, women prepared the food for their families. Mothers still feed their children not only material but spiritual nourishment. In studying the lives of the saints we frequently see the maternal influence on their formations of faith.

Many portraits of St. Anne depict her sharing a scroll or a book of scripture with Mary as a young girl. Could we glean that Mary being fed the Word of God by her mother from such an early age enabled her to converse so simply - and wisely - with Gabriel at the Annunciation?

There are frequent accounts in the Bible of people conversing with God usually in an overture for some particular mission or calling. Men and women argue in their struggle for clarification as their rational mindsets are changed to understand the truth and mystery of God's direction or, in the case of the feeding of the five thousand, by signs of God's maternal care.

Philip asks Jesus a rational question, such as Mary had asked the angel. Words are not used in response: instead an opportunity is given to witness the marvels of God's providence in not only providing for each of us but for everyone - to the full.

The one body and spirit St. Paul refers to in Ephesians, offers an answer to our natural human inclinations in our questions to God. Being humble, gentle, patient, loving, peaceful and hopeful is the way to nourish not only our own souls but each others' in unity with the family of God.
