A DROP OF WATER IN THE FLOOD

Ever wonder who is sitting next to you in the pew, that stranger with a story? You may take him or her in at a glance... But do you know who they are, what brought them here, what they are thinking about? What if - for one moment - you could peer into their soul and know what they had been through? Have you ever wondered what their spiritual life looks like?

Wouldn't you want to know?
What if they wondered the same about you?

In the Gospel today, we hear a story we know well: Noah's Ark, the flood. We typically to associate this with destruction, demise, survival. What if we turn the theme on its axis and see it as starting over, beginning anew, staying awake?

The flood story can help us hone our reflection story. Instead of seeing our story as a tidal wave, think of it as a drop of water. The little things, the details, the thoughts we have daily, are the ones that whisper truths about us.

Instead of asking big overwhelming questions like, Who am I? or What have I to offer the world? Consider asking little intimate questions like: What do I feel right now? What has brought me clarity lately? What is the soundtrack of my mind, the drone note of my daily life? What influences me, captures me, moves me? Why did I arrive here at Mass today? What am I looking for here?

Consider offering your neighbor in the pew a moment to peer into your soul. A drop of water is all it takes.

PARASHAT HASHAVUAH

During the Advent season (which begins this weekend), you are encouraged to read the Torah portion that is shared by our Jewish brothers and sisters in synagogue on the Sabbath. The Torah portion that is read is called the week's Parashat Hashavuah (Hebrew for "Torah portion"). Along with the regular bulletin reflection on the Sunday Lectionary readings, the book, chapter, and verses of the week's Torah portion will be printed in the bulletin throughout Advent. Please read the passage on your own and share the discussion questions with your friends and family.

The "Torah portion" of the week is given a Hebrew name that reflects a significant word or short phrase in the selected verses. This week's Parashat Hashavuah is entitled "Chayei Sarah," meaning "Life of Sarah" and it is **Genesis 23:1-25:18**.

This week's Torah portion is called "the Life of Sarah" and yet the assigned passage begins with this matriarch's death. Many commentaries claim that Sarah's death reminds the reader that the family Sarah and Abraham created together- and specifically- the covenant made between them and God continues and thrives. In fact, Abraham's family undergoes some major milestones: in this passage we discover that Abraham buries Sarah, Abraham commissions a servant to find a wife for his son Isaac, Rebekah is chosen as Isaac's wife, Abraham remarries and has more children, and drafts a will ensuring that Isaac's divine inheritance is safeguarded.

Discussion Question: What are the milestone's that have defined our family's sense of generations? (Take some time to discuss with your family)


