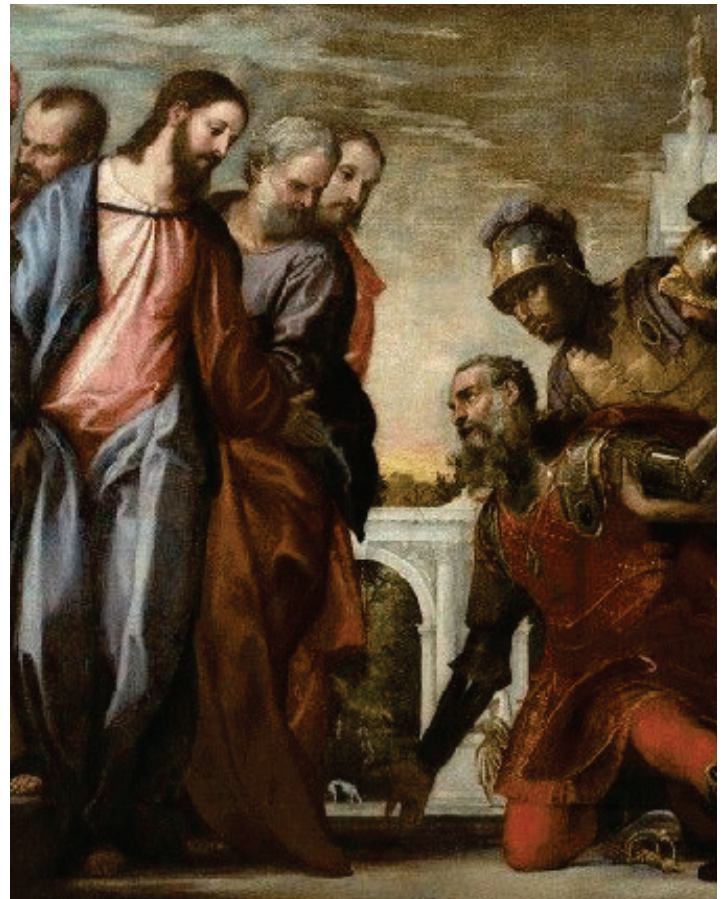
We respect your decision to remain masked or unmasked.
