

PASTOR'S DESK

February 6, 2022 – Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?' 'Here I am,' I said, 'send me!'" (ISAIAH 6:8)

Every day, in little ways and in big ways, God asks, "Whom shall I send?" Whether it is someone to take on a new ministry, to give a friendly smile to a stranger or to say a word of encouragement to a friend, God constantly provides opportunities to help someone in need. God is always talking to us; we just need to pay more attention. When you hear God calling have the courage to walk through the door and say, "Here I am, Lord."

Synodal process called forth by Pope Francis, challenges us all to be involved. What is your experience of Church? As JFK said in his inaugural speech *ask Not what your country can do for you but what can you do for your* (church, parish)? Pope Francis said on Monday (Jan.24) that the two-year global consultation process leading to the Synod (Oct 2023) on Synodality is "a great opportunity" for Catholics to listen to one another. Writing in his World Communications Day <u>message</u>, released on Jan. 24, the pope expressed concern that people were "losing the ability to listen," both in the Church and wider public life.

A Gift of Christ continues: This little historical booklet compiled for the occasion of 25th anniversary of the Parish in 1978; details some remarkable moments. The original chapel and church (1953) still stands today on north side of existing side (residence) building. It was originally just a tool shed; but as the story goes, "working feverishly three Augustinian brothers cleared it of machinery and rubble, strengthened and shifted it around (turned 90 degrees) and then converted it into a temporary church" Wow! As the parish celebrated its silver jubilee in 1978, the 24 foot by 60 foot building remains a lasting monument of hard work and dedication. Eventually this special 'sacred space' which served as the parish, was turned over to the Knights of Columbus Council in July 1966. Interesting to note: a formal decree was issued declaring a parish Dec. 1, 1953 and a few days before on Nov. 27, Archbishop Lemieux, said permission to erect a parish in City View had been obtained by the Holy See. This decree was read out in nearby parishes: St George, St Bonaventure and St Patrick Parish, Fallowfield.

Proposal for the front of church: If you have ever visited St John the Apostle Church on Baseline Road, you will notice a beautiful "glass enclosure" at front of church. This is commonly known as "the glass house". No question, it is gathering space which offers easy access for seniors and physically challenged people, it minimizes pollution and is a quiet entrance to the Church. We are hoping to propose this as an option for our Church, which currently has a small entrance way, a porch, probably half the size of your garage. Can you see this happening at St. Augustine?

Refuge night is back: Join us for an evening of praise, worship and adoration on Friday, Feb 18th, at 7:00 p.m. The theme is *Be my Valentine: Embracing the Sacrament of Marriage*. At a time when there are almost no more church weddings taking place, it has become apparent that it will be a great challenge to recover and to reinvigorate folks to rediscover the Sacrament of Matrimony and the blessing of the church. If you are engaged, are getting married, or have been married for a year or more, please join us for this special evening. Bring a photo and share some thoughts on "Why did I get married in the church?" Why did I embrace the Sacrament of Marriage?" "Why was it important to have a Church wedding? For those of you who cannot be present in person, please share a short video/I-phone message, or photos of your wedding and tell us why you embraced the Sacrament of Marriage.

When the priest doesn't show: Did you know that since I live at the same place where I work, I am "on call" 24/7? As I was quietly enjoying a cold Saturday morning "inside" on Jan .29th, my cell phone went off. A parishioner/friend from my previous parish at St Martin de Porres called saying "we are in need of a priest" for the funeral at 10:00 a.m., however the time is now 10:20 a.m. "Can you help us out?" It seems that the priest they were expecting was a no show and the pastor was away in Nigeria. Have you ever scrambled to get ready, or to respond to an emergency a fair distance away and at a moment's notice, have a reasonable homily ready, change gears and deal with traffic at -25C? Anyway, when I got there, I greeted the family. They were so relieved to "have a priest" for their loved one's funeral who had just turned 100. Although it was a challenge to get ready, it was nice to be able to return to my previous parish and to give them a hand when they needed it.


