### PASTOR'S DESK

#### January 30, 2022 – Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, it is not pompous..." (1 CORINTHIANS 13:4)

Do you get jealous? Do you focus more on the things that other people have than on the gifts that God has given to you? Are you pompous? Do you acquire more possessions to impress others? At times we are all guilty of these things. Pray for more humility. Humility helps us become less "self-centered" and become more "God-centered" for the sake of others. You will note, this 2nd reading often is used at weddings ... an exercise in what truly matters for the Christian life.

**Beware of Email Scams from Someone Pretending to be a Priest:** There has been an increase in scams involving people pretending to be a priest you know, asking for money, gift cards or other help. Please be advised that no priest will send an email to parishioners asking for money, gift cards or other services. Scams often use the priest's name but with a strange address and the message itself often does sound like the priest you know. Exercise caution whenever you receive an email from anyone you know that sounds suspicious. If in doubt, contact the priest using the parish's email or phone number. Please be cautious. The scams are becoming more sophisticated.

A Gift of Christ was the title of a 'history' booklet that was put together at the 25th anniversary of the parish, (1978). This was a great tribute to the long history of St Augustine's from the days that the property was purchased to shortly after the arrival of Fr Cyril Smetana, OSA, who arrived in Ottawa on June 18, 1953, to begin his pastoral work and to facilitate the Genesis of a new parish here in the west end. He became known as the Founder and Pioneer of the parish. Please note that at that time this was just farmland (about 200 acres). Many stories have been told about how "the cows were beginning to be a nuisance" amid all the work going on with the new parish. Volunteers were raising funds by whatever means they could devise. "They organized many events such as food showers, card parties, bingo games, offerings and the like". These funds were used for the purchase of lumber, nails, paint, tools, etc. Much effort was exerted by those early pioneers in the summer and fall of 1953. Many thanks went out to Brothers Cyril and Ephrem who gradually helped transform the Victorian age farmhouse into an elegant, white painted monastery and rectory with a small chapel, which still stands today. The site was named St. Austin Heights.

**The Whole Language: The Power of Extravagant Tenderness,** by Fr. Gregory Boyle, S.J., is a must read.
