

From the Pastor's Desk 4TH Sunday of Easter – May 7TH

"I came that they may have life abundantly" Do you know the peace and security of the Good Shepherd who watches over his own? The Old Testament often speaks of God as shepherd of his people, Israel. The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want (Psalm 23:1). Give ear, O Shepherd of *Israel, you who lead Joseph like a flock!* (Psalm 80:1) We are his people, and the sheep of his pasture (Psalm 100:3). The Messiah is also pictured as the shepherd of God's people: He will feed his flock like a shepherd, he will gather the lambs in his arms (Isaiah 40:11). Jesus says he is the *Good Shepherd* who will risk his life to seek out and save the stray sheep (Matthew 18:12, Luke 15:4). He is the Shepherd and Guardian of our souls (1 Peter 2:25).

On this Vocation Sunday we pray for our vocation in life starting with our Baptism. We pray for Vocations to priesthood and religious life. We offer our financial contribution for vocations to assist those in seminary, like Connor O'Hara of Holy Spirit Parish, Stittsville, in his first year of seminary training ... St. Augustine Seminary, Toronto.

The Good Shepherd and Guardian of our souls What can shepherding teach us about God and our relationship with him? At the end of each day the shepherd brought his sheep into shelter. They knew the voice of their shepherd and came at his beckoning. So familiar was the shepherd and his sheep, that each was called by a distinct name. In the winter the sheep were usually brought to a communal village shelter which was locked and kept secure by a guardian. In the summer months the sheep were usually kept out in the fields and then gathered into a fold at night which was guarded by a shepherd throughout the night. He was literally the door through which the sheep had to pass.

ARCHBISHOP'S LETTER FOR THE WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

FOR VOCATIONS – MAY 7: Each year of the liturgical cycle the Gospel on the 4th Sunday of Easter is taken from the 10th chapter of John where Jesus speaks of himself as the "good shepherd". The simple definition of a vocation is a "calling". Catholics understand a vocation to be closely connected with a calling from God as rooted in our Baptism. The primary vocation of the baptized Christian is to fall in love with God and to lead others to God as possible.
