

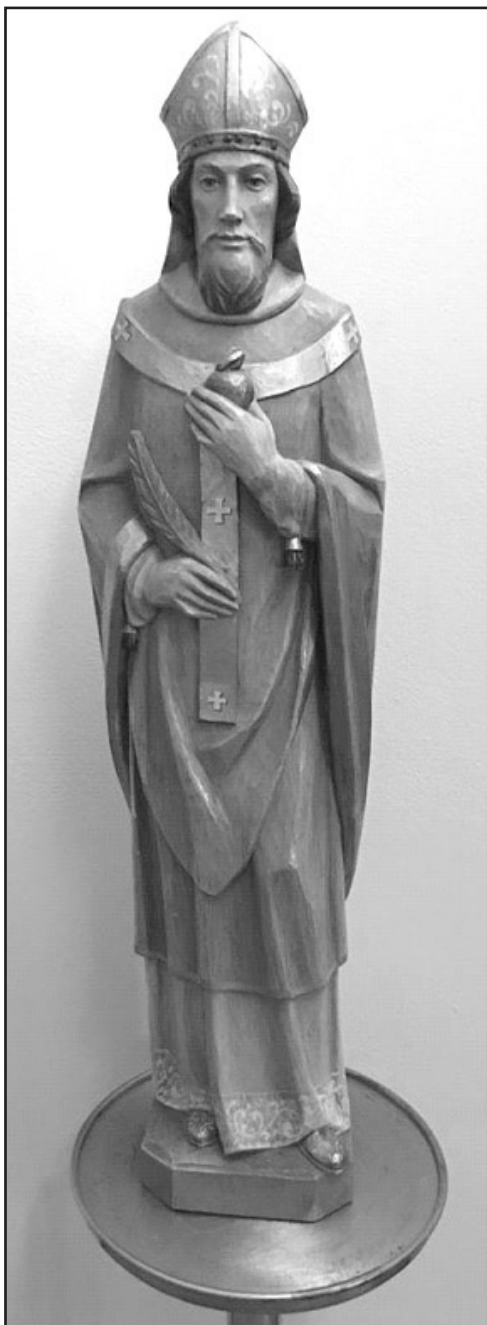

NOVEMBER 3, 2019 – 31ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, ‘Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I will give to the poor, and if I extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over.’ ” (Luke 19:8)

We are all called to gratefully give back to the Lord in proportion to the blessings we have been given. This means everyone isn't called to give the same amount but is called to give equal sacrifice. No amount is too small or insignificant! Open your heart, how is God calling you to be more generous with your financial resources and possessions?

What are folks saying/believing in pews: According to a new Pew survey, 7 out of 10 people who identify as Catholic do not believe that the bread and wine “actually becomes” the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Pew's survey also found that among Catholics who regularly attend Mass once a week, 63% know the Church's teaching; 14% flat out reject it; and 23% don't know. However, 75% of Catholics who attend monthly or yearly believe the Eucharist is just a symbol, and so do 87% of Catholics who seldom or never attend Mass. **Check it out "online" - Bishop Barron and the pew survey: <https://www.ncronline.org/news/theology/pew-survey-shows-majority-catholics-dont-believe-real-presence>. I brought this to your attention a few weeks ago within the homily. This is worth some serious reflection and prayer!!

Amazon Synod may be over; however, there is much on the table for Pope Francis to have serious reflection. It all comes down to 'conversion of hearts" in so many areas, the future of the Amazon and its people, a new Evangelization outreach for this part of the world. The implications of results of Synod in ordaining married men, and further study on role of women and possible diaconate for women. Again, check online for further info; America magazine, National Catholic reporter, Vatican news... to name a few. **Are you interested in these topics?** There is no question this will have FAR reaching impact on the rest of the Church universally.

November is a month of “remembrance”. This special time as we begin All Saints and All souls reminds us like in the Eucharistic prayer; praying for the Saints as intercessors and prayers for all our loved ones; who have gone before us ... marked with the sign of Faith. This all brings to mind communion and our close bond with all those who have gone before us; enjoying the heavenly kingdom promised to them and us!

The statement presents a brief overview of poverty in Canada today, with a focus on the current housing crisis, and provides a short list of some key Catholic organizations engaged in the alleviation of poverty in our country. Through this statement, the Catholic Bishops of Canada call for collaboration between charitable organizations, all levels of government, and dioceses/eparchies, as well as local parishes, to support individuals who are in need.
