

A New Sign of HOPE - St Ann Parish Refugee Resettlement Update

In 2016, with the help of ORAT, (Office of Refugees for the Archdiocese of Toronto) a dedicated group of Parishioners from St. Ann's and St Joseph's parishes started on a journey of learning, patience and hard work. They formed a committee in order to learn how to sponsor a refugee family. We would like to share a brief history and a 2020 update here. February 2016 initial meeting to establish a committee of interested parishioners.



May 2016, we met with Luciano Moro from ORAT at the Rectory to give us an informed talk about the expectations of welcoming a refugee family. The rest of 2016 and 2017 were filled with planning, meeting, collecting, attending ORAT training sessions on Processing Times, Settlement Needs, Budgeting and Finances. In March 2017 our committee was informed of 3 possible families who had been approved by International Refugee Committee. We knew our funds were limited so we chose the family of four rather than a larger family. At that point we learned that the family had been living in Syria but fled to Lebanon due to the war in their region of the country. They were also fearful of persecution as Armenian Christians. Our committee then went into overdrive collecting furniture, clothing, household goods and gift cards, donated from generous parishioners. There was a lot of paperwork and deadlines to meet and most of it was handled by Theresa our chairperson.

January 2018 the family had their first interview with Canadian Immigration in Lebanon with hopes of a possible arrival in September however, that date was changed until the end of February 2019. Time flew and finally the official message our family would arrive on Feb 25, 2019 at 4pm. Fr. Wilson and six committee members headed to the airport and after 2 hours the family (we recognized them from their photos) walked out those doors. We were armed with winter gear, which did not impress the children but after quick greetings, luggage and people were loaded into vehicles. The family was driven to their new home. The good Lord and the Sisters of St. Joseph answered our prayers for lodging. We were given a furnished 3-bedroom apartment at a modest rent to help the family get established for their first year.

Now Harout, Maral, Jean and Meghri were here. The next month was even busier with a whirlwind of ORAT meetings for them, setting up of medical and dental appointments, registering children for school and adults for ESL classes. Setting up a bank account, using a bank card and use of the transit systems were also important teaching/learnings.

Slowly life started to take shape for our family here in Toronto with the daily routines of classes and food shopping and cooking. Life was not easy. It didn't take long to learn that life is expensive in Toronto. Our committee was responsible for this family for their first year in Canada. As the year moved on, they became increasingly worried about how they could afford rent in Toronto after their first year.

With good Syrian friends in Laval Quebec, they started planning to move. We learned from Harout and Maral, that there is a large Armenian community in Laval, as well as an Armenian Christian church. They had good friends from Syria who had already been in Laval for a few years and they would help them settle in. As good parents, we bid our "family" adieu. Maral (the Mom) was amazing, negotiating in Arabic on the phone over the rent even getting the landlord to reduce it a bit for them. She singlehandedly packed up the family and hired a vehicle to move them to Laval on a rainy November 27, 2019.

Some committee members had plans to visit the family after they got settled in Laval Quebec, but Covid has not permitted that. We keep in touch via technology. In the last four years life hasn't been easy for the committee members nor for the family. They started again here, in two different provinces, however with support they have managed to settle and care for their family in spite of all the difficulties the pandemic has presented. This week we received a beautiful picture of their newest family member. Harout and Maral welcomed their new baby daughter into their family...their Canadian daughter. Maybe at this time of advent as we wait in hope for Christmas celebration of a baby born long ago and as we pray for a healthier 2021, this new little Canadian baby is a real sign of hope, love and gratitude for us all.
