Patience

Pastoral Reflections by Rev. Wilson Andrade, CSC

Today in the Gospel we heard the parable of the fig tree. The gardener asks for more time to cultivate the tree to become fruitful. This parable speaks about God's patience with us. God is ready to give us a second chance to become fruitful. Patience is one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit.

There are two Greek words translated as "patience" in the New Testament. Hupomone – means "a remaining under" or steadfastness in difficult times. Another Greek word is Makrothumia – Makros (long) and thumos (passion or temper). It is translated as longsuffering, the ability to endure pain and suffering without complaining. Patience in the letters of St. Paul literally means "long temper," not short temper. He writes to be patient and "watch out… not to fall."

In the book of Exodus, God is presented as the Person who is Passionate (*image of the burning bush never consumed*), a God ever Present (*God of ancestors, knows human suffering and God's Name: I AM WHO I AM*) and a God of Promise (*deliver us from the oppression to a Promised Land*). Our God, the Psalmist proclaims, is "*merciful, gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.*" (Ps. 103).

Patience is a gospel virtue we need to live in our fast changing world. Our society drags us into situations where we experience anxiety, worry, agitation and fear. Today let us reflect and pray for the grace to overcome fear and anxiety, waiting patiently on God's time to fulfil God's promise.


